Logan Ward, Planning, said AVI PC, on behalf of Ruthanne Hubbard, submitted a Subdivision Permit and Plat application for Lone Star Estates, located east of the Morningstar Rd. and US Hwy. 85 intersection. The application was submitted to subdivide approximately 76 acres into 12 single-family residential lots.

Chris Lovas, AVI engineer and agent for the applicant, said he had corresponded with County Attorney Mark Voss to address his concerns from the Jan. 5, 2021 meeting when this agenda item was postponed. The concerns were: access to the subdivision from Powerhouse Rd., grazing lease agreements, and covenants. Mr. Lovas noted a road petition was recorded in the Laramie County Clerk's office, Book 1706 Page 1, which established a dedicated public road for access to the subdivision from Powerhouse Rd. Mr. Lovas read the six notes added to the updated plat which included wording for private maintenance of the portion of Powerhouse Rd. serving as access to McCrae Rd. until such time as the County accepts the road for maintenance.

Ms. Ward said based on the evidence provided, staff recommends approval of the subdivision permit and plat application with the adoption of findings of fact a with the following conditions: 1) All minor corrections including grammatical errors shall be resolved prior to recordation of the final plat. 2) A "legend," as required by state statute, be added to the plat in a clearly visible location, stating: "NO PUBLIC MAINTENANCE OF STREETS OR ROADS" and "NO PROPOSED CENTRALIZED SEWAGE SYSTEM." 3) Note # 4 be stricken and replaced with the following: "All roads or streets within this subdivision shall be constructed to County standards and privately maintained. The portion of Powderhouse Rd., serving as access to McCrae shall be constructed by Developer to County standards and maintained jointly by any and all landowners within the subdivision, until such time that this section of Powderhouse is accepted by Laramie County for maintenance. No date for such acceptance is set. 4) The designation of, "POWDERHOUSE (ROW EASEMENT)" should be modified to, "POWDERHOUSE ROAD." The call-out on the plat of detail in regard to the state easement should remain.

Commissioner Thompson asked if all the conditions are satisfied. Ms. Ward noted Planning received an updated plat and all conditions, except for condition 1, have been met. The updated plat is out for agency review.

Chairman Malm opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. Hearing no PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Malm closed the hearing.
