Project Description

Project Justification: Community Resilience

Briefly describe the project and how it supports the investment justification.

Laramie County is requesting funding for CERT supplies to replace medical supplies and missing tools and gear along with adding GPS units and community outreach items. This project falls under the Community Resilience section, as it assists in the response and recovery from a threat or incident. The Laramie County CERT team can be deployed across the county to help with proper response and recovery efforts. Within the 2019 THIRA, our county discussed logistics and situational management and the ability for community coordination and outreach efforts during manmade or natural hazards. The requested gear will assist our county and others in providing proper supplies and tools to carry out the mission and services of CERT. Proper equipment and supplies is critical for volunteers being able to effectively respond to threats within the community.

Describe threats and hazards that create the need.

We anticipate the requested CERT tools and gear to be critical in a variety of natural hazardous events such as flooding and tornado response. The tools and gear would allow our CERT team and other authorized users to help respond and recover from an event. The County will utilize the CERT volunteers for assistance in supporting first responders with items such as damage assessment and light search and rescue operations.

Explain this project's dual applicability to all-hazard events (manmade and natural hazards):

The Laramie County CERT team has already received training and certification and are ready to be deployed when requested. The cause of the threat/scene is not a prohibiting factor for the team or requested gear to be utilized. However, it should be noted that CERT is not going to be requested under certain circumstances if volunteers are deemed to be at risk in such an event as a chemical spill or other similar hazard.

Identify portions of the THIRA and SPR that the project will address.

Our request addresses the Laramie County THIRA with examination of community resilience, operational and community coordination, and proper situational assessments. The THIRA confirmed our known gap in this area with response and recovery efforts. The tools, supplies and gear that we are

requesting for the CERT trailer and team will provide the County with a reliable and flexible asset for community response efforts. CERT volunteers provide agency partners with a collaborative response effort for many natural or manmade incidents. Our THIRA identified the need for mobilizing resources and one of our best resources is the community itself.

How will this project increase capability or reduce vulnerabilities in protecting, preventing, responding, or recovering from an act of terrorism?

The proposed request will increase our county's ability and capacity to reach out to CERT volunteers for assistance in acts of terrorism, where it is safe for non-first responders to assist. Our request is for medical supplies to replace outdated or expired items along with replacing expired hard hats and replacing missing and outdated tools provided for volunteers to utilize while on scene. We are also requesting funds to purchase ten mobile GPS units for our CERT volunteers to use when necessary on scenes with limited visibility or in light search and rescue operations. Additionally, we are requesting funds to purchase community outreach materials such as water bottles or sunscreen along with an anemometer. These outreach items will further the publics knowledge and awareness of emergency response efforts that are in place within Laramie County.

Provide justification on how the project will be maintained, supported, and sustained.

Laramie County will assume all responsibility for the maintenance of the equipment to keep it operational and ready for use internally and externally by CERT volunteers. The requested equipment can easily be sustained by Laramie County for future operations. All requested equipment will be stored in the Laramie County CERT trailer or in the Laramie County Emergency Management Office and will be easily accessible for use by volunteers. Our request will assist Laramie County with providing volunteers with the necessary tools and gear for proper response operations.

Describe existing capability levels.

The Laramie County CERT program was started around 2005 in a partnership between EMA and the health department with funds from Homeland Security. The health department was tasked with organizing and providing trainings to community residents. We no longer have access to prior training rosters or records, due to employee turnover, but safely estimate that around 100 community members have been trained under the CERT program. Our active CERT team is comprised of thirty-five members and we have two trainers. Our current tools and gear are approximately 10-13 years old. Our goal over the next year is to focus on training and providing public outreach to the community. The CERT trailer purchased with WOHS funds is operational and available for use. The equipment and supplies that are not date specific are in working condition, we just need to update the expired items and expand our capabilities with GPS units and anemometer(s).

Please provide an overview of the trainings, exercises, real events, or other needs assessments that have identified this as a gap (included the cause of the gap).

Laramie County participates in all planning and training efforts coordinated by our EMA office. We participate in all exercises, trainings, tabletops and planning efforts with LCCC, refinery, CFD and the state. Through the THIRA process, our county has been made aware of various manmade and natural hazards that would benefit from the use of trained volunteers. The CERT program has the capability to provide needed work force in these events under the direction of first responders.

How will this project reduce capability gaps?

If funded, the county will purchase needed replacement tools and gear for CERT volunteers. We would also purchase community outreach materials and handheld GPS units. Proper CERT supplies will allow volunteers to serve the community and provide valuable assistance to first responders in the goal of protection of life and property. The majority of our request is to replace outdated or expired medical supplies; this will allow our volunteers to provide life saving measures when needed. Requested items will also encourage and reassure volunteers that our county values their commitment to the community and appreciates their willingness to assist when called.

Throughout the years, Laramie County has invested within the community to bring the CERT program to everyday citizens. Training has been offered and accepted for approximately fifteen years. Our active CERT team is ready to respond if called, however they need proper supplies for their protection and for providing the best possible assistance to the public in the event of an emergency. The lack of updated tools and medical supplies is a concern for not only the county but also for our volunteers. It is a risk and liability at this point to send out volunteers with expired and outdated medical supplies and gear. The need for updated CERT supplies has been brought to our attention through various exercises and training scenarios. The need for GPS units and anemometers has also been identified as a priority to provide our volunteers with the proper supplies for a magnitude of events.

- A grant award is anticipated to occur in October 2020. At this time, we will establish a budget
 and accounting line items to prepare for the grant. After funding has been awarded, we will go
 out for a formal quote process according to Laramie County Procurement Policies on the
 requested supplies. We are anticipating this will be completed by the end of December 2020.
- 2. We plan to receive quotes the beginning of February 2021 and at that time all quotes will be evaluated and a vendor recommended. We will also be conducting research on the proposed supplies for proper fit into CERT operations. Once this process is complete, we will be moving forward with our selected vendor to purchase the equipment. We are allocating three months for this process.
- 3. Beginning in May of 2021, we anticipate receiving the tools and gear. At the time of the supplies arriving we will inventory and sticker all items.
- 4. Our final milestone will be to close out and finalize all grant items for the grant from the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security. We anticipate this concluding around November 2021.

Our request is comprised of three categories to bring the Laramie County CERT team back into full operational capacity. We are requesting ten handheld GPS units for volunteers to use in a variety of situations such as hazardous weather, search and rescue and basic operations in the rural community. We are requesting money for community outreach items make everyday citizens aware of emergency response operations within Laramie County and the assets we have to help keep our community safe. Finally, we are requesting funds to update and replace items in our CERT packets to include expired medical supplies. Much of what we are purchasing will replace outdated supplies such as gauze, bandages, splints etc... We also have a need to replace non-sparking tools and equipment such as hardhats. All purchases will follow the Laramie County Procurement Policy and will be stored and properly maintained by the County. By investing in our CERT volunteers, we will be addressing the following gaps identified in the THIRA to include operational coordination, situational assessments, logistics, mobilizing resources and providing community outreach management. Through these avenues, Laramie County will be able to better build and sustain community resilience.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS), ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSFD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, and local governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity;

WHEREAS, the collective input and guidance from all Federal, State, and local homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, and local emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management it is critical that Federal, State, and local organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, uniform standards for planning, training, and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or diseasters;

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the county's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local agency readiness, maintain first responder safety, and streamline incident management processes,

WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various city/county incident management activities, including current emergency management training programs; and

WHEREAS, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY that the National Incident Management System (NIMS) is established as the County standard for incident management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Jeanine West, or her successor in the position of Director of HMA, is appointed as agent of the Lexamic County Board of Commissioners to execute and submit items and certifications for NIMS compilance.
