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## RESOLUTION APPROVING SIX OPIOID SETTLEMENT SUBRECIPIENT AWARDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,178,888.81.

**WHEREAS**, effective December 21, 2021, the State of Wyoming entered into a OneWYO Opioid Settlement Memorandum of Agreement between its Attorney General and Participating Local Governments; and

**WHEREAS**, in January 2023, Laramie County began to receive national opioid distributor settlement payments; and

WHEREAS, opioid funds must be used in a present and forward-looking manner to actively abate and alleviate the impacts of the opioid crisis and co-occurring substance abuse in Wyoming; and

**WHEREAS**, the Laramie County Commissioners created an opioid committee to review and discuss the target population, needs, gaps, resources and provide a timeline for funding use; and

WHEREAS, the Opioid Committee provided a recommended proposal and matrix to the Board of Laramie County Commissioners to establish a grant program for organizations serving the community; and

WHEREAS, the Laramie County Commissioners encouraged organizations to apply for the available opioid settlement funding; and

WHEREAS, Laramie County received twelve (12) applications from various organizations requesting a total combined amount of \$4,750,511.70; and

**WHEREAS**, the Opioid Committee reviewed each application to ensure compliance with the settlement distribution and the Memorandum of Agreement with the Wyoming Attorney General's Office; and

WHEREAS, the Opioid Committee recommends that the Laramie County Commissioners fund six organizations for activities outlined in associated applications in the collective amount of \$2,178,888.81; and

WHEREAS, attached hereto as "Exhibit 1" is a comprehensive description of the total funding approved by the Board of Laramie County Commissioners as indicated in yellow.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that, the Board of Laramie County Commissioners hereby approves funding for qualified organizations in an amount not to exceed \$2,178,888.81 in conformance with "Exhibit 1."
