A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RATIFIED SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE WYOMING OFFICE OF HOMELAND SECURITY FOR THE FFY 2020 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (SHSP), ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING TO REQUEST FUNDING FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$30,000.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF: REQUESTED FUNDS WILL BE USED FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO PORTABLE LIGHT TOWERS WITH GENERATOR POWER.

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security receives FFY 2020 SHSP funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and;

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security distributes a portion of these FFY 2020 SHSP funds to Wyoming Counties and;

WHEREAS, the Laramie County Board of Commissioners is eligible to apply for and receive FFY 2020 SHSP funds for the Emergency Management and;

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Project Description

Project Justification: Other

Briefly describe the project and how it supports the investment justification.

Laramie County Emergency Management is requesting for the purchase of two portable light towers that are affixed to a generator on a trailer. Our request falls under the project justification of logistics, as it provides operational support to responding agencies within the community. The light towers will be used for evening and night operations to efficiently respond to and work a scene. The light towers are a piece of mobile equipment with one or more high intensity electric lamps and a mast. The lights are attached to the mast, which is attached to the trailer and generator.

Within the 2019 Laramie County THIRA, our department can contribute to addressing the core capabilities of operational coordination, interdiction and disruption, screening, search and detection, physical protective measures, community resilience, and logistics and supply chain management through the purchase and implementation of the mobile lighting towers. The county ranked operational coordination as a priority and this includes having the capability and capacity to coordinate with all agencies on scene. On scene logistics and protection for both citizens and first responders is critical to the success and efficiencies of an operation.

Describe threats and hazards that create the need.

There is a wide spectrum of hazards and events that our request could be utilized for including manmade situations, CBRNE events, terrorist events and natural disasters. In each of these cases, the mobile lighting towers could be used to provide scene illumination to prevent the endangerment of responders as the majority of our response area is rural with a lack of artificial lighting. In addition to aiding first responders, emergency lighting also has the benefit of calming citizens by creating a less threatening environment.

Currently, Laramie County relies on the state to provide any emergency lighting needs. We have limited emergency lighting within the community and what we do have is task lights or spotlights. During the train derailment in October 2018, we realized quickly that we did not have adequate lighting for night response and the one state provided lighting trailer was not sufficient for ongoing operations and protection of first responders. Another incident where emergency lighting would have been beneficial was during the Federal tornado response, assessment and security. Emergency lighting would have allowed us to work the scene longer into the evening to

aid first responder crews with assessments and lighting would have been helpful to security operations overnight.

Explain this project's dual applicability to all-hazard events (manmade and natural hazards):

The portable light towers can be used on all scenes. The cause of the threat/scene is not a prohibiting factor for the equipment to be utilized. This equipment can also be a deployable asset that can be requested and used throughout the state if needed.

Identify portions of the THIRA and SPR that the project will address.

Our request of two portable light towers addresses the Laramie County THIRA with examination of operational coordination, on scene security, and logistics. The THIRA confirmed our known gaps in operational coordination. The train derailment illustrated that we did not have quick access to artificial lighting for night operations. The requested equipment would facilitate a safer scene for all first responders. This equipment will also address several core capabilities to include situational assessment, physical protective measurements, community resilience, and interdiction and disruption of emergency operations. Our request will help ensure a safe and illuminated environment to protect citizens and first responders and alleviate the need for items such as flashlights and spotlights. Incident Management will benefit from having full knowledge of all physical threats and hazards that could be hidden due to the lack of proper lighting. These light towers will help facilitate quicker coordination and response on scenes.

How will this project increase capability or reduce vulnerabilities in protecting, preventing, responding, or recovering from an act of terrorism?

The proposed project will increase our department's safety and capacity to coordinate with other first responders and agencies on scene. The portable light towers will reduce vulnerabilities, due to lack of light for first responders on scene. This equipment will facilitate proper protection, prevention, and response to all scenes to include acts of terrorism. The equipment will be especially helpful in suspected terrorist events to be used for scene size up before sending in first responders.

Provide justification on how the project will be maintained, supported, and sustained.

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Grant Application**

Laramie County will assume all responsibility for the maintenance of the equipment to keep it operational and ready for use internally and externally by MOU partners. The requested equipment will be sustained by Laramie County for future operations. Our request would assist the Laramie County EMA, Fire Warden and the state in operational coordination and situational assessment. The portable light towers would also be made available to other first responder agencies.

Describe existing capability levels.

Laramie County currently utilizes state resources to address the needs described above. There could be situations where the state equipment is not available and where task or spot lighting is not efficient for scene illumination. This is especially true when events are affecting more than one area within the State of Wyoming. Again, we learned through the train derailment and numerous accidents on I-80 that portable lighting towers are a critical safety component for first responders during evening and night response operations.

Please provide an overview of the trainings, exercises, real events, or other needs assessments that have identified this as a gap (included the cause of the gap).

Laramie County participates in all area trainings and exercises. We have been highly involved in all planning and training efforts within our County and the State of Wyoming. We participate in all area exercises, trainings, tabletops and planning efforts with LCCC, the refinery, CFD and the state. When we participated in the 2019 THIRA, not having adequate on scene lighting capabilities was identified as a concern and marked as a gap for proper equipment.

How will this project reduce capability gaps?

Laramie County will use the portable light towers in a variety of scene responses that require artificial lighting for operations. It will be used during critical incidents to aid responders in viewing all hazards, while on scene in an efficient manner versus smaller areas of illumination. Laramie County will cooperate with other local and regional agencies, and will provide access to the portable light towers when requested and covered by a

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Memorandum of Understanding. On scene, responses will be efficient and streamlined through the ability to view the entire scene unobstructed.

Lighting is a time critical element to emergency response to allow expedited efforts to include prevention, mitigation, response and recovery. If funded, this equipment will support our county efforts within the community and provide extended access to all first responders. It is the goal of Laramie County Emergency Management to have portable lighting available to all emergent situations that could occur in the evening or night hours or in limited visibility situations.

1. A grant award is anticipated to occur in October 2020. At this time, we will establish a budget and accounting line items to prepare for the grant. After funding has been awarded, we will go out for a formal bid process according to Laramie County Procurement Policies on requested equipment. We are anticipating this will be completed by the end of December 2020.
2. We plan on receiving bids the beginning of February 2021 and at that time all bids will be evaluated and a vendor recommended. We will also be conducting research on the proposed equipment for proper fit into our department. Once this process is complete, we will be moving forward with our selected vendor to purchase the equipment. We are allocating three months for this process.
3. Beginning in May of 2021, we anticipate receiving the equipment. We are estimating six months for this process to allow for fluctuating availability and shipping schedules. At the time of the equipment arriving we will inventory and sticker all items.
4. Our final milestone will be to close out and finalize all grant items for the grant from the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security. We anticipate this concluding around November 2021.

We are requesting funding to purchase two portable generated light towers at approximately \$15,000 each. The requested equipment will ensure proper functioning without limitations for usage. The equipment will be easily transportable for all first responder needs and can be deployed throughout the state if requested. The equipment will go out to formal bid under the Laramie County Policy for Procurement and the equipment will be properly maintained and inventoried on an annual basis.

The gaps identified are situational assessment, operational coordination and on scene security and logistics management. If funded, this equipment will contribute to reducing the identified gaps in the mentioned core capabilities above and address the investment priorities under community resilience, CBRNE response, and terrorism response along with everyday scene needs. We will be able to build on these core capabilities for future strengthening of operations not only in Laramie County, but statewide.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS), ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, and local governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity;

WHEREAS, the collective input and guidance from all Federal, State, and local homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, and local emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management it is critical that Federal, State, and local organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, uniform standards for planning, training, and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters;

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the county's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local agency readiness, maintain first responder safety, and streamline incident management processes;

WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various city/county incident management activities, including current emergency management training programs; and

WHEREAS, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY that the National Incident Management System (NIMS) is established as the County standard for incident management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Jeanine West, or her successor in the position of Director of EMA, is appointed as agent of the Laramie County Board of Commissioners to execute and submit items and certifications for NIMS compliance.
