The Laramie County Risk Department would like to request funding in the amount \$5,400.00. This funding will allow us to purchase two "All Combtant" skills training kits. We have two law enforcement officers qualified to instruct first responders skills needed to treat potentially preventable deaths. Our deputies not only work with local first responders, they travel throughout the State of Wyoming offering training to multiple agencies. Right now, our need is to provide the trainers with training kits. The County does not own the mass casualty training equipment required to adequately train large groups of people. Currently, we rely on borrowing materials from the State of Wyoming, however, it is difficult to reserve and not guaranteed to be available.

Laramie County is being proactive in training its employees to successfully respond to manmade or emergency events. A previous SHSP grant helped us to provide Stop the Bleed Kits around the courthouse and provided initial training to employees. This request builds upon that success and provides additional training resources to move the program forward.
