County Clerk Debra Lee explained which Voter Centers will be used during the 2020 Primary and General Elections. Ms. Lee went over the criteria which was used to evaluate and choose the best locations in Laramie County. Ms. Lee received a directive from the Wyoming Secretary of State to limit the number of polling locations to no more than seven because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Chairman Malm opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. County Clerk Chief Deputy Dale Davis read an email from Boyd Wiggam into the record. Hearing no further PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Malm closed the hearing.

Amendments for Concentrated Feeding Operations

Brad Emmons, Planning, said a public hearing was held on March 17 to determine whether an odor footprint tool could be used along with other requirements to come up with a setback distance. Based on discussions at that meeting and in previous meetings, the Planning office developed regulations for review and approval of the Board of County Commissioners. Emmons said that if the Commissioners decide to adopt new regulations, Planning staff recommends the Board replace the existing section 2-2-111 of the amended 2019 Laramie County Land Use Regulations with the new section 2-2-111 as presented at the May 5 Laramie County Commissioners Board meeting.

Chairman Malm opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. Ron Butler, resident via phone, and Jim Hasting, resident, spoke against the proposed changes in the regulations, and in favor of leaving the 30-year old regulations in place. E-Comments were received from Jim T. B, Kristina Butler, Laurie Hamilton, Greg Rix, and Terry Sandberg. Hearing no further PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Malm closed the hearing.

Board members spoke about the need to use a more scientific and fair approach for regulating setbacks of concentrated feeding operations. Members agreed that while the order footprint tool was not perfect, it provided the best model for making a decision, and each operation would still need to provide a site plan that would be reviewed by the Board. In addition, the proposed regulations require a fixed setback distance of no less than one mile.

The Board thanked Brad Emmons and staff for the extensive work they put into development of the proposed regulations.

Chairman Holmes, to repeal section 2-2-111 of the amended 2019 Laramie County Land Use Regulation and replace with a new section 2-2-111 of the amended 2019 Laramie County Land Use Regulations contained in the staff report presented to the Board of County Commissioners at the May 5, 2020 meeting. Brad Emmons, Planning, Steil Surveying Services, LLC, on behalf of Dave Coleman Realty, LLC, submitted a Subdivision Permit and Plat application for Lakota Tracts, located south of Horse Creek Rd. and west of Little Star Dr. This application proposes subdividing 45 acres to create four residential-use tracts averaging 11.25-acres each.

Mr. Emmons said based on evidence provided, staff recommends approval of the subdivision permit and plat application with the adoption of findings of fact a and b with the following condition: All agency comments regarding corrections to the plat are to be resolved prior to recordation of the final plat.

Chairman Malm opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. Hearing no PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Malm closed the hearing.
