A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RATIFIED SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE WYOMING ASSOCIATION OF SHERIFFS AND CHIEFS OF POLICE (WASCOP) ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING TO REQUEST FUNDING FOR THE LARAMIE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$96,950.00.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF: REQUESTED FUNDS WILL BE USED TO PURCHASE 15 VITAL MONITOR SENSORS FOR THE ADULT DETENTION CENTER AND THE JUVENILE SERVICES CENTER.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of Laramie County desires to participate in the Wyoming Association of Sheriffs and Chief's of Police opioid grant by sponsoring this grant application to assist in financing this project; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of Laramie County has been provided with preliminary cost estimates and information on this project; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY that a grant application in the amount of \$96,950.00 be submitted to the Wyoming Association of Sheriffs and Chief's of Police for consideration of assistance in funding the Laramie County Sheriff's Office.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Sandra Bay, or her successor in the position of Laramie County Grants Manager, is appointed as agent of the Laramie County Board of Commissioners to execute and submit applications and certifications for these funds and to receive funds and implement the programs funded under this grant.

PROPOSAL:

Implementation of continuous vitals monitoring system at the Laramie County Sheriff's Office in both the Adult Detention Center and the Juvenile Service Center.

STATEMENT OF NEED:

The Laramie County Detention Center and Juvenile Services Center routinely house individuals entering custody under the influence of opioids or in the early stages of opioid withdrawal. These individuals present an increased risk of serious medical complications, including respiratory depression, decreased level of consciousness, and death. While other substances are encountered, opioid use continues to present one of the most significant and immediate medical risks within the detention setting.

The intake process, combined with peak operational periods and the overall size of the Laramie County Detention Center, requires detention deputies to manage and monitor many arrestees and inmates simultaneously. As the largest detention facility in the State of Wyoming, the volume of incoming and housed individuals presents ongoing challenges in maintaining consistent observation, particularly during high-activity periods involving intakes, releases, court movements, and professional visits. While staff conduct regular checks and actively monitor detainees, the ability to continuously track vital signs in real time is limited. This creates a gap in the early detection of medical distress and increases risk to both detainees and staff, particularly for individuals experiencing withdrawal or other medical complications.

The Juvenile Services Center presents additional concerns. Juveniles frequently enter custody with undiagnosed substance use disorders and underlying mental health conditions that are not readily identified during intake. Many are unable or unwilling to effectively communicate symptoms, and signs of distress may present as behavioral issues rather than identifiable medical concerns. In addition, the Juvenile Services Center does not maintain a continuous 24-hour on-site medical presence, requiring detention staff to monitor and identify potential medical issues as they arise. This increases the likelihood that withdrawal or medical deterioration may go unrecognized in its early stages and reinforces the need for enhanced monitoring capabilities. The failure to identify and respond to medical distress in a timely manner exposes the agency to significant liability and places staff in a reactive position rather than a proactive one.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this proposal is to implement continuous vitals monitoring systems within both the Adult Detention Center and Juvenile Services Center to enhance detainee safety, improve medical oversight, and support staff in identifying early indicators of medical distress.

OBJECTIVES:

The implementation of this system is intended to:

- Increase the ability to identify early signs of medical distress in detainees experiencing withdrawal or other medical conditions.
- Enhance real-time monitoring capabilities within intake, medical housing, and observation areas.
- Support timely staff response through automated alert notifications when vital signs fall outside established parameters.
- Provide detention staff with additional tools to assist with housing and classification decisions based on medical need.
- Improve overall operational safety and reduce reliance on constant direct observation alone.

PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION:

The Laramie County Sheriff's Office is requesting the acquisition and implementation of:

- Twelve (12) vitals monitoring devices for the Adult Detention Center
- Three (3) vitals monitoring devices for the Juvenile Services Center
- These devices will be deployed in designated intake and admission areas, specifically within Central Booking at the Adult Detention Center and the Admitting area at the Juvenile Services Center. These locations represent the highest-risk environments, as individuals are newly received, maybe under the influence of substances, or entering early stages of withdrawal, requiring increased monitoring during this critical period.

The system will be integrated into existing operations without disruption to current workflows. Staff will receive training on device use, alert recognition, and response protocols. Medical staff will be responsible for interpreting data and guiding intervention decisions.

OPERATIONAL USE:

The vitals monitoring system will be utilized to support:

- Intake screening and initial classification placement decisions
- Monitoring of detainees undergoing withdrawal
- Observation of detainees with known or suspected medical conditions
- Housing decisions within medical or restrictive environments

Alert thresholds will be established in coordination with medical staff. When alerts are triggered, staff will respond in accordance with established protocols, including immediate assessment, medical notification, and documentation.

BENEFITS TO OPERATIONS:

Implementation of this system will provide:

- Improved detainee safety through early detection of medical emergencies.
- Enhanced staff awareness and response capability without requiring constant physical observation.
- A force multiplier for detention staff during high-demand periods, particularly in booking and intake.
- Greater flexibility in housing decisions by allowing detainees to be monitored outside of traditional medical units when appropriate.
- Reduced likelihood of medical emergencies requiring outside transport.
- Strengthened compliance with constitutional standards related to detainee medical care.

KEY PARTNERS:

The success of this program will rely on coordination between:

- The Laramie County Sheriff's Office Detention Division, responsible for daily operation, deployment, and staff training.
- Contract medical providers, responsible for clinical oversight, data interpretation, and treatment decisions.
- Local healthcare partners, including hospital services, for escalation of care when necessary.

IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE:

Upon approval, procurement and installation of the monitoring devices will occur immediately. Staff training will be completed within 30 days of delivery. Full operational deployment will follow shortly thereafter. The system will be incorporated into existing intake, medical, and housing procedures without requiring significant modification to current practices.

SUSTAINABILITY:

The proposed system builds upon existing detention operations and requires minimal ongoing maintenance. Annual maintenance and support will be incorporated into the detention division's operational budget. Continued collaboration with medical providers will ensure the system remains effective and aligned with clinical standards.

BUDGET REQUEST:

The estimated cost for the monitoring system, including fifteen devices for both the Adult Detention Center and the Juvenile Services Center, along with installation, setup, training, and a one-year maintenance plan, is quoted at \$96,950.00.

- Twelve (12) vitals monitoring devices with subscription and installation for the Adult Detention Center for a total of \$77,460.00
- Three (3) vitals monitoring devices with subscription and installation for the Juvenile Services Center for a total of \$19,490.00

Attached please find our quotes from Reassurance Solutions-the vendor we would like to move forward with if the request is funded. The three quotes represent (adult detention center, juvenile services center and the combined cost). This includes everything needed to get the system up and running and supported by the detention centers. Following the first year, the Sheriff's Office will ensure that all continuing maintenance and software costs are responsibly managed and adequately funded.

CONCLUSION:

This proposal represents a proactive approach to addressing a known and ongoing risk within detention operations. The implementation of continuous vitals monitoring system will enhance detainee safety, support staff in high-demand environments, and reduce the likelihood of preventable medical emergencies. By adopting this technology, the Laramie County Sheriff's Office will strengthen its ability to provide safe, effective, and responsible detention services while maintaining compliance with established standards of care.
