the Laramie County audit, ending June 30, 2021. Mr. Niedermuller prefaced his remarks by applauding the great work of the finance team and noted it was a challenging year on financial statements because of the impact of COVID-19 and associated grants. He said they issued a clean opinion on all aspects and this was a very positive result for the County.

Mr. Niedermuller stated that all categories of County funds have a positive fund balance and this is very rare for a governmental entity. He further noted that the County

has adequate reserves based on its spending rate. Commissioners acknowledged the work of the finance office and director Stanley Walker and the work of Sandra Newland, grants manager.
