Our Families Our Future is a Wyoming organization focused on bringing disadvantaged youth and families out of poverty. Our intervention model is based on the Fleming Associates Young Parent Program which was established in Laramie County in 1986 to meet the educational, job training and life skills needs of low-income single parents.

Services, our programs address the "Temporary Assistance to Needy

Families" (TANF) purpose "to end the dependence of needy parents on government benefits by promoting job preparation, work and healthy relationships."

Our success is based on helping adolescents, young mothers and female heads of household develop the life and job skills needed to improve their employment potential and relationships. They complete extensive training in a supportive group environment. Most important, our participants get jobs that lead to higher paying wages and move them out of poverty.

CLIMB Wyoming Young Parent Program Overview: Serving income eligible young, single mothers.

Program length: 4–5 months

To date, the GED diploma has been awarded to more than 200 participants in Laramie County.



The CLIMB Wyoming Young Parent Program serves young, single mothers who are not in school and meet Federal poverty guidelines in Wyoming. They are among the many disadvantaged women and teens across the state who have trouble in the job market because they lack the skills and education that employers require. Participants are trained and supported in groups to develop the life and job skills needed for employment. They receive academic training so they can earn their GED. During the final three months of the program, participants are placed in jobs with business partners that lead to higher paying wages.

Key Elements of the Young Parent Program:

- ➤ Life skills training addresses child support, parenting, repeat pregnancy, accessing community resources and substance abuse issues
- ➤ **Job skills training** develops skills such as application and resume writing, interviewing techniques and interpersonal communications
- ➤ Individual and group counseling addresses barriers to personal growth
- ➤ **GED preparation** academic training geared toward earning a high school equivalency diploma
- ➤ Job placement participants are matched with employment opportunities in demand occupations such as CNAs, medical insurance billing, phlebotomists, cashiers, medical lab processors, childcare workers, physical therapy assistants, landscapers, teaching assistants, office clerks and other service sector positions

Proven Results of the Young Parent Program:

- ➤ **80**% of program participants are placed in private sector employment work experience training positions
- ➤ 74% of program participants are maintained in jobs after program completion
 - ▶ 85% of program completers achieve a GED

This program is based on the Fleming Associates Young Parent Program, a nationally acclaimed paradigm for moving disadvantaged young mothers out of poverty.

The Female Heads of Household Program trains income eligible, single mothers in well paid non-traditional and healthcare careers such as construction craft, truck driving and medical transcription. The program includes job training, life skills workshops, counseling and job placement assistance, allowing participants to move into well paying careers and move their families out of poverty.
