Justin Arnold, Planning, said the Comprehensive Plan for the City of Cheyenne requires that any proposed amendment goes to Laramie County for review and comment. The comprehensive plan amendment changes the future land use map for an area to be annexed into the city between I-25 and Division Ave, south of College Dr. Mr. Arnold said the purpose is to facilitate development of High Plains Business Park. Most of the transportation network amendment covers largely undeveloped land within county jurisdiction. The two amendments tied to the comprehensive plan are to guide the City of Cheyenne for an area to be annexed and subdivided.

Mr. Arnold said Planning staff is satisfied with the process and outcome of the future land use amendment to the city's Comprehensive Plan. However, Planning staff is unsatisfied with the process of the transportation network amendment to the plan. Mr. Arnold said staff expressed concerns about the lack of communication and opportunity to provide input to the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), of which both Laramie County and the City of Cheyenne are partners. He said neither County Planning nor Public Works were notified or invited to participate in MPO discussions about the transportation network amendment, which covers some eight square miles of county jurisdiction and abuts multiple existing county developments. He further noted that developing a network amendment without advice and comment from the county can cause problems.

Commissioner Malm underscored the need for consultation and collaboration among the city, county and MPO. Mr. Arnold proposed holding monthly meetings between the City of Cheyenne and County Planning departments so both entities are on the same page.

Seth Lloyd, City Planning, acknowledged communication breakdowns and information not provided to county staff in a timely manner and said he will ensure it does not happen again. Mr. Lloyd said the land use amendment is to change zoning from urban and mixed-use residential to mixed-use employment. He noted the mixed-use employment development patterns will likely decrease traffic.

Commissioner Malm questioned if the project would impact Wallick Rd. Mr. Lloyd said the project would extend the rights-of-way and improve service to Wallick Rd and Division Ave. Commissioner Health talked about the inconsistency in the width of the road. Mr. Lloyd said he would review the road widths and a revised plat map will show the correct width for the entire project.

Commissioner Holmes asked if the city will be responsible for funding the majority of the project. Tom Mason, MPO, said responsibility for building High Plains Rd needs to be worked out, with part done by the developer and some through potential grants.

Charles Bloom, City Planning, said the city intends to maintain the roads. He noted the eastern 100-acre part adjacent to Division Ave would be open and natural space. He said that rights-of-way for Division Ave is shown as a collector and an 80-ft right-of-way width. He acknowledged the different road widths and said they will look at adding the appropriate right-of-ways to bring it up to standards.

Chairman Thompson opened the meeting for PUBLIC COMMENT. Hearing no PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Thompson closed the comment period.

Mark Voss, County Attorney, spoke about the time limits set in statute and when the election can occur and it would have to wait for 90 days because of the filing period. Mr. Voss said the election will be by mail ballot after the first of the year.

William Haifley, applicant, expressed his concerns about additional delays in getting the application processed and his concerns about another 90 days to have the election. He said the application was filed in April. He noted there is 100% support from the community for creating the district.

Dale Davis, County Clerk's office, noted the various steps for formation, which included a review of the petition, public hearing and protest period. He noted the process is lengthy and this is the final step to direct the County Clerk to conduct an election.

Mason Schuricht, Planning, said AVI, PC, on behalf of the Eldon Stellpflug Revocable Trust, submitted a zone change application for Sunset Tracts, 3rd Filing, Tract 7 and a portion of Tract 8, located at 8908 Yellowstone Rd. The application is for a zone change from AR - Agricultural Residential to CB - Community Business to allow for continuation of an existing landscaping business along with indoor and outdoor commercial storage.

Mr. Schuricht said based on evidence provided, staff recommends approval of the zone change with the adoption of findings of fact a and b.

Chairman Thompson opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. Doug Selby, member of the King of Glory Lutheran Church, spoke about adding conditions to the zone change. He said he supports what the applicant is planning but noted he would like to see an enclosed storage area. Mr. Selby spoke about a GIS mapping or deed error regarding the vacation of Longhorn Rd. Kelly Schroeder, AVI and agent for the applicant, said that the application's legal description came from the County Assessor. She said both Mr. Selby and Mr. Stellpflug understand who owns which property, but the deeds may not match the county's GIS system. She said they could rectify the issue by having each party record new deeds. Hearing no further PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Thompson closed the hearing.

The Board discussed approving the zone change or having deeds recorded first to clean up ownership of the portion of the vacated road. Ms. Schroeder agreed to postpone the zone change until land ownership is corrected. Chairman Thompson asked if conditions requested by the church to exclude adult entertainment establishments, bars, cocktail lounges and liquor stores could be addressed.
