RESOLUTION APPROVING COWBOY RACING, LLC TO CONDUCT PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING ON LIVE HORSE RACING, HISTORIC HORSE RACING AND SIMULCAST EVENTS AT 1720 CLEVELAND AVENUE, CHEYENNE WYOMING

WHEREAS the Wyoming State Legislature passed and the Governor of the State of Wyoming signed into law changes to Wyoming Statutes, Title 11, Chapter 25, to permit pari-mutuel wagering on historic races; and

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Gaming Commission has adopted rules and regulations regulating pari-mutuel wagering on simulcast events, including historic races; and

WHEREAS, Cowboy Racing, LLC currently holds the necessary and appropriate permits issued by the Wyoming Gaming Commission to operate simulcasting facilities, historic horse racing, and live horse racing in the State of Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, the Laramie County Board of Commissioners recognize the economic benefits to Laramie County through live horse racing, historic horse racing, and simulcasting within Laramie County; and

WHEREAS, the Laramie County Board of Commissioners recognize that it is through revenue derived from simulcasting and historic horse race wagering at locations off the permitted live horse racetrack premises that allows a live horse racing operator to conduct the live racing days required under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 11-25-104(m) and Wyoming Gaming Commission Pari-Mutuel Rules and Regulations, Chapter 10, § 3 within the State of Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, Cowboy Racing, LLC is a live horse racing operator that is both (i) licensed to conduct the minimum live race days required under Wyo. Stat. Ann § 11-25-104(m) and Chapter 10 of the Pari-Mutuel Rules and Regulation of the Wyoming Gaming Commission within Laramie County on an annual basis and (ii) is conducting said live horse racing pursuant to Statute and Rules in Laramie County (excepting days that are cancelled for good cause due to weather or other uncontrollable circumstances); and

WHEREAS, Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 11-25-102(a)(vii)(B) provides that “simulcasting may be conducted off the permitted premises only if the board of county commissioners of the county in which such simulcasting will be conducted grant [grants] its approval”; and

WHEREAS, said requested premises is located at 1720 Cleveland Avenue, Cheyenne, Laramie County, Wyoming.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS THAT:

Pursuant to Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 11-25-102(a)(vii)(B), Rules of the Wyoming Gaming Commission, Pari-Mutuel, Chapter 10, § 3(d) and in accord with Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 11-25-201(a) the Board of Commissioners hereby approves Cowboy Racing, LLC to conduct pari-mutuel wagering on historic horse racing and simulcast events at 1720 Cleveland Avenue, Cheyenne, Laramie County, Wyoming 82001.

1. No more than 125 machines may be located at the Premises without the prior written approval of the Commission.
2. This permission to operate is issued to Operator and may not be transferred from the Operator without the prior written approval of the Laramie County Board of Commissioners.
3. This license to operate granted by this Resolution shall be for a term of five (5) years from the commencement of pari-mutuel wagering on historic horse racing or simulcast events at the Premises. Operator shall submit a letter to the Laramie County Board of Commissioners beginning pari-mutuel wagering activities confirming the start date of the time period.
4. Operator shall submit a renewal application no later than sixty (60) days prior to expiration of this Resolution.
5. Renewal applications shall include a presentation of the financial and community benefits of the operation and evidence of continued compliance with the Rules and Regulations of the Wyoming Gaming Commission. After receipt of a renewal application, the Board will hold a properly noticed public hearing. Renewal applications may only be denied for good cause. Renewal Terms shall be for no less than three (3) years if granted.
6. During any Term, the County Commissioners shall have the right to revoke this or any other subsequent Resolution for the Permittee only for good cause. Examples of "good cause" include but are not limited to:
 - i. A determination by the Commissioners that the Operator has a history of gross violation of Wyoming Statutes, the terms and conditions herein, the Rules and Regulations of the Wyoming Gaming Commission, local ordinance; or
 - ii. Suspension or revocation of license by the Wyoming Gaming Commission;
 - iii. Based on evidence before the Commissioners, the welfare of the people residing in the immediate vicinity of the permit premises is in fact adversely and seriously affected by Cowboy Racing's operations.
 - a. Standard (iii.) can be found in Wyoming Liquor License Statutes and the County and Cowboy Racing Parties hereto adopt the case law found in Wyoming interpreting these conditions for liquor license renewals/transfers as interpretive precedent for the meaning of these conditions.

The County will provide a minimum of 15 days notice of any intent or action to revoke permission as provided in this resolution. The Commissioners will set a public hearing within forty-five (45) days of notice or revocation at which evidence may be taken. Cowboy Racing and any interested parties may be heard in regard to the revocation and a decision by the Commissioners may be made upon the issue, or continued for issuance of written findings and conclusions.

7. Operator shall update the Board on an annual basis regarding its operations including tax revenue and any operational issues.

8. By signature below, Cowboy Racing agrees and consents to the above terms and conditions.



INTRODUCTION

Thunder Plains Park (TPP) is a new horse-racing track under development by Cowboy Racing, LLC (Cowboy Racing), a partnership consisting of local developers Edwards Development and nationally leading racetrack operator 1/ST Racing and Gaming, a wholly owned subdivision of The Stronach Group. The new track is under construction about 8 miles east of Cheyenne center, north of 1-80 at CR 140.

The Wyoming Gaming Commission (WGC) on November 21st granted Cowboy Racing a license to operate live racing at TPP beginning in the summer of 2025. Additionally, WGC granted a parimutuel simulcasting license to Cowboy Racing, which authorizes the operation of off-track betting at facilities (OTBs) in Wyoming subject to county approval of the locations. The OTBs will offer live simulcast wagering and Historical Horse Racing machines. This application requests authorization and approval by the Laramie County Commission. Supporting materials are attached.

Cowboy Racing's mission is to create a world-class, state-of-the-art racetrack and equestrian center and develop 300+ acres into a regional recreational destination. We are doing this for the horsemen and women, the equine athletes, the jockeys, the breeders, owners, trainers, and all the people who support horse racing in Wyoming. We are assembling a team of industry experts and track specialists to utilize the most up-to-date technology and engineering to build the first full-size racetrack in Wyoming with safety as the highest priority.

The Stronach Group is a world-class technology, entertainment and real estate development company with Thoroughbred racing and pari-mutuel wagering at the core. The Stronach Group's 1/ST business (pronounced "First") is North America's preeminent Thoroughbred racing and pari-mutuel wagering company and includes the **1/ST RACING & GAMING**, 1/ST CONTENT, 1/ST TECHNOLOGY and 1/ST EXPERIENCE businesses, while advocating for and driving the 1/ST HORSE CARE mission. 1/ST represents The Stronach Group's continued movement toward redefining Thoroughbred racing and the ecosystem that drives it. 1/ST RACING & GAMING drives the best-in-class racing operations and gaming offerings at the company's premier racetracks and training centers including Santa Anita Park and San Luis Rey Downs Training Center (California); Gulfstream Park, home of the Pegasus World Cup Championship Invitational Series, and the Palm Meadows Thoroughbred Training Center (Florida); and the Maryland Jockey Club at Laurel Park, Rosecroft Raceway, Bowie Training Center, and Pimlico Race Course, home of the legendary Preakness Stakes (Maryland).

All required occupational licenses for individual personnel are being processed by WGC and are a prerequisite for operating the OTB facility. Please see attachments illustrating the location site map, and other elements relevant to the application.



BUSINESS PLAN SUMMARY FOR OFF TRACK BETTING AT FIRE STATION

The following information is provided pursuant to direction from Laramie County staff and otherwise complies with Wyoming Gaming Commission Rules for the issuance of the license/permit, as detailed in Chapter 10 Simulcasting, Section 3, subsection (c)(i)(A-H)(i-iii).

1. This facility is a retired fire station, once operated by the City of Cheyenne Fire Department and constructed in 1981. It was one of the two oldest operating fire stations in the city until a city sales tax funded the construction of a new fire station, which opened in 2022. The name "Fire Station" is a temporary moniker, as the business name has not yet been finalized.
2. This facility is in design stages for a renovation that would utilize the main floor spaces, including the garage floor, as a primary gaming floor, and would renovate the existing back offices to house the centralized control aspects of Cowboy Racing's operations. Surveillance, some administrative offices and potentially a repair bench would be located at this facility.
3. F&B operations will be developed for this facility with a limited menu.
4. The facility will be open seven days a week. Operating hours are expected to be Monday-Thursday 11 a.m.-10 p.m., Friday-Saturday 11 a.m.-11 p.m., and Sunday 11 a.m.-8 p.m. See Firehouse floor plan below.
5. Live simulcasting will be displayed seven days a week from as many as 10 tracks a day. The tracks to be simulcast will be authorized by the WGC.
6. The simulcast facility will also house up to 115 Historic Horse Racing terminals for authorized use. Specific games and titles will be authorized by the WGC upon application, prior to operations.
7. Wagers offered at the OTB include all parimutuel pools hosted and commingled by the Host of the approved simulcast; any parimutuel roping or rodeo or parimutuel sports approved by the WGC; and wagers on HHR machines approved by the WGC.
8. The attendance in the simulcast and HHR area is expected to average 150 customers a day. Cowboy Racing will market to local and surrounding areas, including western Nebraska and northern Colorado.
9. The expected average daily handle through the simulcast operation is approximately \$1,000. The expected average daily handle through the HHR operation is \$160,000.
10. Cowboy Racing anticipates revenues from F&B operations to be approximately \$1,200/day.
11. The cost of operating the facility will be primarily the new labor to be hired, the costs of the services to produce simulcasting and manage the HHR floor, advertising and security. We estimate \$3.0 million in annual costs.



12. The on-site security staff will oversee and manage the HHR floor security during all operating hours. Centralized security surveillance will also occur at this facility, whereby all available security cameras can be viewed by a central dispatch office that can communicate with the network of staff at these facilities. Surveillance cameras will cover the entirety of the HHR operation, including back of house areas.
13. Floor staff will assist customers with machine operation, and voucher cashing will primarily be served by automated redemption machines that dispense cash.
14. Cowboy Racing has contracted, or will, with AmTote for all parimutuel wagering services; Roberts Communications Network for the wide area network and communications circuits to tote hubs and for incoming simulcasting signals; and HHR vendors PariMAX, Exacta, and Ainsworth to supply hardware and game cabinets for the HHR operation.
15. The desired opening date will be March 31, 2025.

BENEFITS TO LARAMIE COUNTY

1. 1% of HHR handle is shared equally by the city in which the OTB operates and Laramie County. This facility is expected to generate \$600,000 to be split equally between the City of Cheyenne and Laramie County.
2. Cowboy Racing expects to hire 46 people to service this location. Those jobs will consist of customer service representatives, security personnel, accounting staff, management staff, and IT technicians. Other jobs related to the development and opening of this enterprise include advertising and printing services, HVAC and electrical contractors, plumbing and carpentry, landscaping and cleaning staff.
3. The proceeds from this facility will accrue to the benefit of Thunder Plains Park, which will conduct live racing each summer at the new facility. Purse revenues from the OTB operations will fuel the racing activity at the track. This results in an economic ripple effect in the community, including but not limited to, added agricultural jobs, sales receipts, tax revenue, tourist traffic, local business growth to service the track and the hundreds of people required to operate the track and care for the horses. (Note: the State of Wyoming is conducting a statewide economic impact and market viability study of Historical Horse Racing to be published in November 2025.)
4. The development of OTB and HHR facilities in Laramie County that benefit TPP are an integral factor in the success of the racetrack, which will multiply those financial benefits to the county and its residents.
5. The added entertainment services provided at the Fire Station facility will strengthen that business and increase the value of its contribution to the city and county without disruption to adjacent businesses and may also increase customer activity for nearby businesses.
