



Cheyenne/Laramie County EOP – Base Plan

Introduction

The Cheyenne/Laramie County Emergency Management Agency takes a proactive role in potential disasters and emergencies, either natural or manmade, for the purposes of "Preparedness, Response, Recovery, Mitigation and Protection" of Laramie County and its citizens. This plan is designed to lessen, or in some cases, prevent loss of life and property during disaster situations.

The goal of the Cheyenne/Laramie County Emergency Operations Plan is to bring together a strong team of agency representatives whose early involvement in an event will expedite the coordination of local resources to assist an impacted area. With the assistance of this plan, the team coordinates the efforts of local services to restore, supply or re-supply local infrastructure and needs of the communities within Laramie County.

The Cheyenne/Laramie County Emergency Management Agency (CLCEMA) is tasked under Wyoming Statute § 19-13-101 et seq. for developing and implementing a crisis operations plan for coordinating local response to events. The Emergency Management Agency along with local first responders and emergency support functions have built this plan to assign responsibilities for carrying out essential support functions and event specific actions.

This plan is updated to ensure compliance with both the "National Incident Management System" (NIMS) and the "National Response Framework" (NRF), but more importantly the "Wyoming Response Plan" (WRP). The State of Wyoming will become our closest ally in times of crisis. They will provide a network of availability to both state level resources and assists in federal response when applicable.

This plan consists of a "Base Plan", "Emergency Support Functions" (ESFs), "Incident Specific Annexes", "Support Annexes", and "Planning Annexes". The Base Plan provides the initial "framework" for the government's response to incident management. It follows "the Incident Command System" (ICS), allowing for expansion and contraction of the organization depending on the needs of the responders and complexity of the incident. The ESFs (listed later in the plan) are used to support the ICS and provide specific needs during an incident. The Incident Specific Annexes are detailed to a pre-determined event, being natural or manmade.

As a representative of government (elected or employed) or as a member of emergency services, it is imperative you know the content of the plan. You can and will play an important role in the government's response to a large scale emergency or disaster. Your preparedness is an essential part of the successful implementation and outcome of this plan by providing the citizens with both "Continuity of Operations" and "Continuity of Government".



Laramie County Emergency Operations Plan – Emergency support functions (esf)

- Lifelines
- The primary objective is to ensure the delivery of critical services that alleviate immediate threats to life and property when communities are impacted by disasters.
 - Stabilization is the highest priority during a response.
 - Organizes the critical services into 8 Lifelines (categories)




Laramie County Emergency Operations Plan – Emergency support functions (esf)



Infrastructure owners and operators of broadband internet, cellular and landline telephone networks, cable services, satellite communications services, and broadcast networks (radio/television). These systems encompass diverse modes of delivery, often intertwined but largely operating independently. Services include alerts, warnings, and messages, 911 and dispatch, and access to financial services.

The **components**, just like the **lifelines**, are fixed. The **subcomponents** provided in the chart can be adjusted as necessary. Not every incident will impact all of the lifelines or components.
