Cate Cundall, Planning, said Steil Surveying Services, LLC on behalf of John Larimore submitted an application seeking approval for a vacation of Lot 7, Block 1, Hope Subdivision. The purpose of the vacation is to allow the property, located at 3050 S Ave B-6, to be subdivided into two separate lots.

Ms. Cundall said based on evidence provided, staff recommends approval of the

Michael Surface, Planning, said Bill and Ann Vossler submitted an application seeking approval for vacation of a portion of the Vossler Tracts, that portion of Tract 4 lying south of Columbia Dr and the east one-half of Tract 5. The purpose of the vacation is to allow for a Family Subdivision Exemption because tracts of land within a platted subdivision are not able to carry out a subdivision exemption. He said lot lines will be redrawn if the Board approves the partial vacation of the property located at 5211 Columbia Dr.

Commissioner Malm asked if the applicant was aware of the staff recommendation to table the item indefinitely and consider another variance. Mr. Vossler said he was aware of the recommendation.

Mr. Surface said based on evidence provided, staff recommends tabling the vacation indefinitely.

Chairman Thompson opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. Jim Casner and Linda Thyarks, residents, addressed the Board. Questions raised were proposed buildings that do not meet covenants and number of horses on the property. Chairman Thompson explained the county is unable to enforce covenants and the questions are beyond the scope of this item. Hearing no further PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Thompson closed the public hearing.

Chairman Thompson requested staff make neighbors aware of the steps moving forward.

There was a discussion on previous practices for splitting a tract of land without replatting. County Attorney Mark Voss said prior to the year 2000, landowners could split a lot without going through the subdivision process, but statutory changes now prevent such splits without approval. Mr. Voss noted the definition of subdivision was changed to include any division of property, eliminating the one-split rule.

A motion was made by Commissioner Malm, seconded by Vice Chairman Lovett, to table indefinitely this item for a future variance. The motion carried by the following vote:
