2. Describe your project.

Our project has two parts to address on scene security, protection and law enforcement. We are requesting funds for Throwbots and Ballistic Shields.

Recon Robotics Throwbot 2: In addressing active threats and volatile situations, the Laramie County Sheriff's Office recognizes the critical importance of obtaining advanced technological tools to ensure the safety of both law enforcement officers and the community. One such tool that proves invaluable in such scenarios is the Recon Robotics Throwbot 2. The Recon Robotics Throwbot 2 offers law enforcement real-time visual and auditory intelligence in hazardous environments. Its compact, remote-controlled design allows officers to gather crucial information safely. Lightweight and portable, it swiftly deploys in various scenarios, aiding in building searches, hostage situations, and search-and-rescue operations. With the ability to navigate tight spaces and transmit live audio and video feeds, it provides vital situational awareness. Deployment of the Throwbot 2 reduces risk to officers by entering hazardous areas ahead of personnel, conducting reconnaissance, and identifying threats. This real-time intelligence empowers commanders to make informed decisions, enhancing operational effectiveness and enabling a coordinated response to active threats.

Ballistic Shields: In addressing active threats within our rural community, the Laramie County Sheriff's Office requires specialized equipment to enhance officer safety and effectiveness. Unlike urban areas, our rural landscape often lacks adequate cover from buildings during high-risk situations, necessitating the acquisition of tactical shields.

These shields provide the following benefits:

- Enhanced Protection: Tactical shields such as the Pointblank Vanguard SWAT Shield and United Shield IIIA and

IIIA+ models provide vital protection for law enforcement officers operating in dynamic environments. They minimize exposure to danger, increasing officer survivability.

- **Specialized Features:** The Pointblank Vanguard SWAT Shield, currently utilized by SWAT teams in Wyoming, offers a robust 20"x30" design tailored for maximum protection and maneuverability. The United Shield IIIA and IIIA+ models are lightweight yet formidable, providing protection against handguns and rifles.
- **Cost-Effectiveness:** While the acquisition represents a significant investment, the shields' invaluable protection justifies the expense. Equipping our teams mitigates the risk of injury or loss of life during high-risk incidents, ultimately reducing long-term costs associated with injuries and disability compensation.

The acquisition of tactical shields is crucial for enhancing officer safety and response effectiveness in our rural community. These shields provide essential protection during active threats, enabling us to safeguard lives and maintain public order. We respectfully request support from Homeland Security to strengthen our law enforcement capabilities and ensure the safety of Laramie County residents.

The City of Cheyenne and Laramie County have a joint SWAT team that is a combined effort by both jurisdictions to train and conduct exercise in order to respond to critical situations involving hostages, high risk warrant execution, active shooter situations and for other incidents involving high risk. We are requesting funding to update our ballistic shields worn by officers and to purchase Throwbots for the entire joint SWAT team to investigate and recon areas that may be unsafe for team members to enter; it would give them the ability to thoroughly study an area in order to make safe tactical entry. This project would help us to build the capabilities necessary to respond to acts of terrorism in our community through proper responder safety to ensure community protection.

Under sustainment of critical transportation, we would be assisting with the reentry of affected areas where our deputies would be required to ensure safety and security. The ballistic shields and Throwbot can and will be used in various situations where the security and safety of both responders that the public is needed.

Budget Narrative

The cost of each Recon Robotics Throwbot 2 unit is approximately \$16,200. Given the critical role this technology plays in enhancing officer safety and response capabilities, the Laramie County Sheriff's Office respectfully requests funding for three units, totaling approximately \$48,600. The acquisition of Recon Robotics Throwbot 2 units is essential for augmenting the capabilities of the Laramie County Sheriff's Office in responding to active threats and volatile situations. These devices provide invaluable situational awareness, minimize risk to officers, and enhance decision-making during high stress operations. We are requesting funds totaling \$60,000.00 to acquire two Pointblank Vanguard SWAT Shields, each priced at approximately \$12,000.00, and four United Shield IIIA and four IIIA+ shields, each priced at approximately \$6,000.00. This allocation ensures comprehensive coverage for both SWAT and patrol units, maximizing our response capabilities.

For the ballistic shields our AEL number is 01LE-01-SHLD Shield, Ballistic and for the Throwbot it is 03OE-07-ROBT Robots.

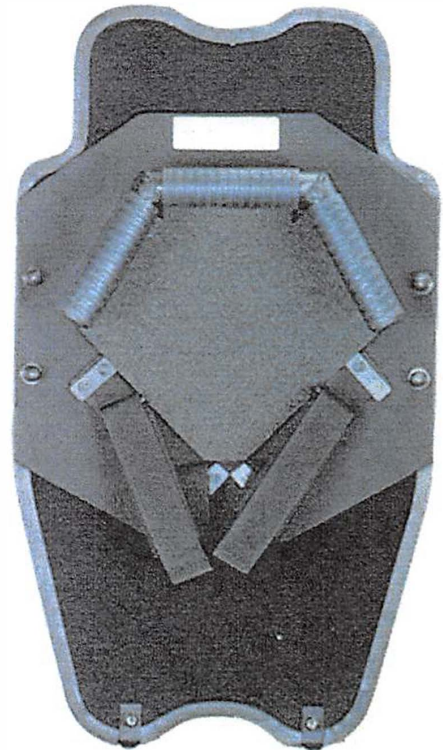
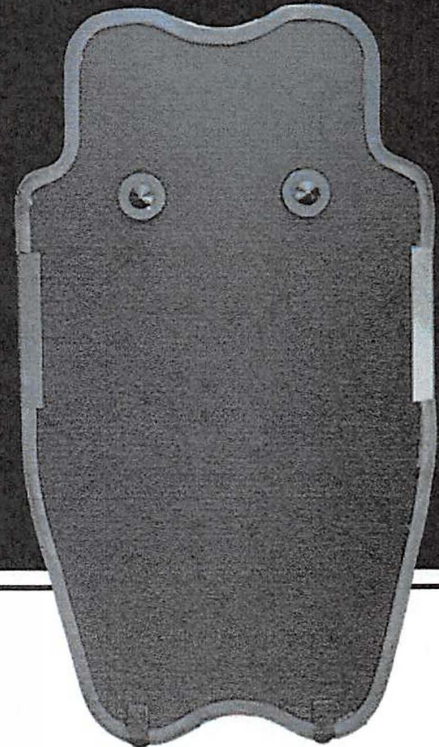

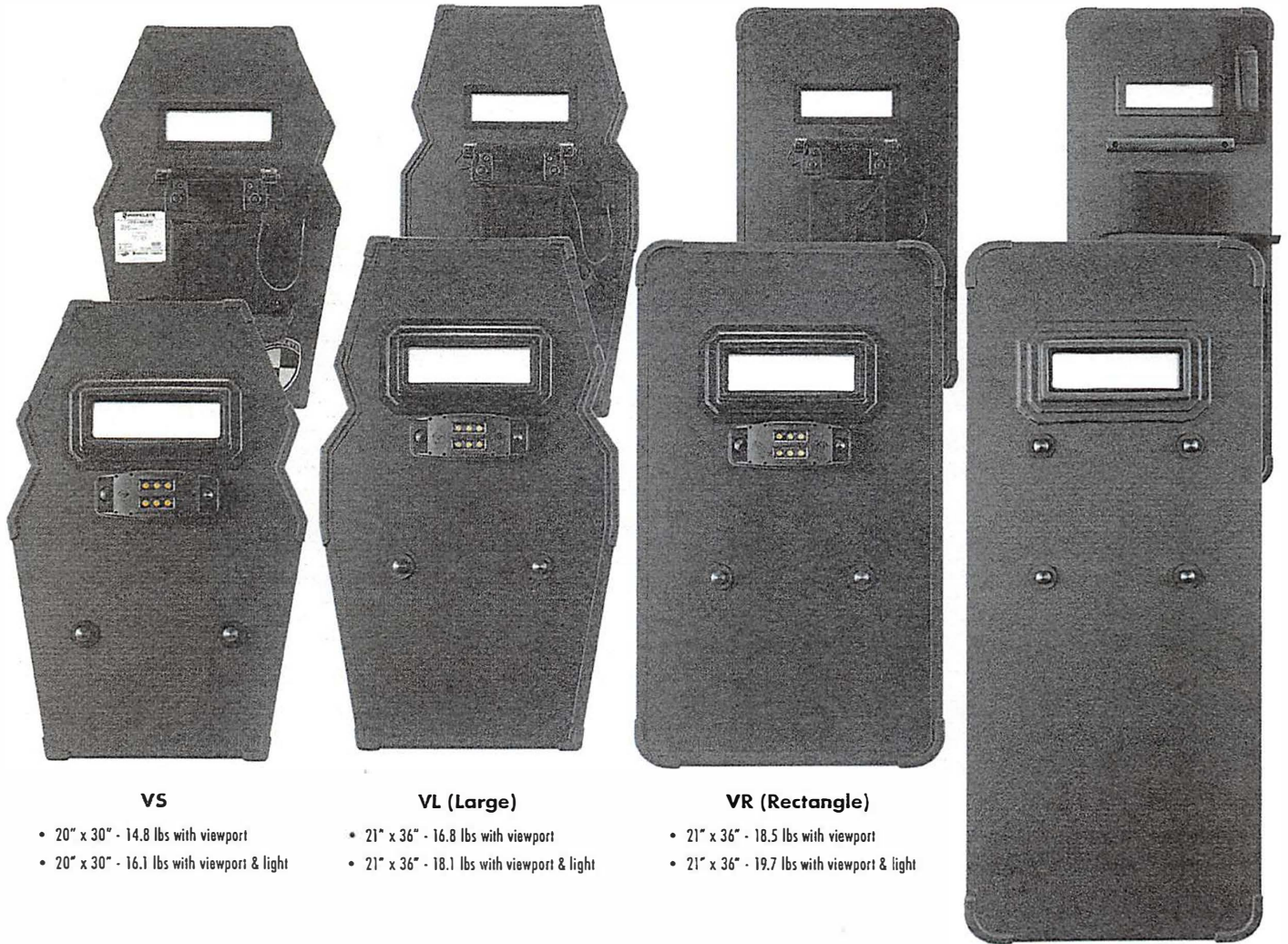
