As the zone change is only for the proposed Tract 23, it will be dependent upon the approval of the Subdivision Permit & Plat. Commissioner Thompson questioned Steve Winchell about a driveway shown on the map. Mr. Winchell said they were going to install a fence parallel to the driveway. Casey Palma, Steil Surveying Services, LLC, said an easement will be created for the driveway.
