2. Briefly describe your project.

Laramie County maintains a communications plan that is fully compatible with the State of Wyoming's WyoLink system, ensuring interoperability with regional and state agencies. However, as WyoLink technology continues to advance, the County faces a critical need to replace aging and unsupported portable radio equipment with modern, fully compatible units.

The current radios, assigned to our communications and mobile command post, are essential for coordinating emergency response and providing on-scene security during major incidents and multi-jurisdictional events. These units are no longer supported by the manufacturer, and replacement parts are increasingly scarce, jeopardizing reliable communication when it is needed most. Without effective and interoperable radio communication, our ability to coordinate with other first responders and execute time-sensitive operations is significantly compromised.

Replacing these outdated radios will enhance operational readiness, improve interagency coordination, and ensure the continued safety of our personnel and the communities we serve.

3. Describe how this project supports efforts to build, sustain, and deliver the capabilities necessary to prevent, prepare for, protect against, and respond to acts of terrorism.

The most recent Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA) confirmed a persistent gap in operational coordination, driven in part by outdated communication technology.

Replacing our obsolete portable radios will significantly enhance on-scene response times and ensure uninterrupted, interoperable communication with partner agencies. This upgrade will strengthen coordinated response efforts across jurisdictions, enabling more efficient deployment of resources and improved situational awareness.

By equipping our mobile command unit with reliable, modern portable radios, we will close a critical capability gap, enhance multi-agency collaboration, and ensure a more resilient and unified response to future incidents.

Our current equipment is no longer adequate to meet the demands of modern emergency response.
The requested portable radios will significantly improve on-scene response times and ensure reliable, uninterrupted communication with partner agencies. This enhanced interoperability is critical for coordinating prevention, protection, response, and recovery efforts — including responses to acts of terrorism and other complex incidents.
By modernizing our communication tools, this project will strengthen our collaborative response capabilities across jurisdictions, reduce operational gaps, and better protect the safety and security of both first responders and the communities we serve.

The Laramie County Emergency Management Agency will be responsible for maintaining and supporting the requested interoperable communication equipment. 
