RE: Proposed Subdivision Regulation Amendments – Fire Dist. Requirements

Following my presentation to you on January 13 concerning the package of proposed subdivision regulation amendments, you had requested that I contact Fire District 2 Chief, Buck Holmes, for recommendations concerning installation of cisterns in new developments. I spoke with him today, and he indicated that his preliminary discussions with other fire districts has revealed less of a need for a cistern installation requirement, and more of a need for a "fire fee" charge assessed to all new lots. He said that a fee approach would allow the various districts to mitigate capital needs as each district sees fit. Some may need cisterns, others a building, and still others, a truck. In theory, the county would collect the fee when the plat was approved, and then be sent directly to the appropriate district.

Buck indicated that he wanted to work this fee idea through the various districts, and then come back to the county with some language to incorporate it into the subdivision regulations. I told him that we would proceed with the current package of amendments, without any fire district requirements at this time, and then introduce their proposal when he was ready.

RE: Fire Safety Community Facility Fee request

Buck Holmes called me today requesting my assistance in putting Subdivision Regulation and Building Code amendments together that would levy and earmark fees for the purpose of supporting the fire districts with capital needs attributed to new development. He indicated that the various districts support him on this concept.

His proposal would 1) reduce the existing \$50/acre fee on new rural subdivisions to \$25/acre, that is set aside for strictly recreation purposes, 2) establish a new, *additional* fee on new rural subdivisions at \$50/acre, and earmark that for the fire district it is collected in, and 3) establish another new fee, collected when a building permit is issued, on new dwelling units falling in the "exempt" category (40 acre type developments, family exemptions, existing vacant parcels, etc.) levied at the rate of \$25/unit, again earmarked to the pertinent fire district.

Before I proceed to draft any of these amendments, your direction to do so, is requested. Please let me know if you need to go over any of this first.
