The safety of Laramie County Residents is at risk without shooting range regulations. The Laramie County Land Use Regulations need to add in requirements that all public, commercial ranges or ranges operated by the government or private entity be required to be certified by a professional shooting range designer who is approved by the National Rifle Association and the National Shooting Sports Foundation. The certification of the range must be provided to the county for verification. The range must also be inspected every year to verify range is maintaining safety design requirements. These ranges must be required to hold an insurance policy in the case of any bodily injury or property damage incurred as a result of the shooting range.
