Project Description

Project Justification: Interoperable Emergency Communications

Briefly describe the project and how it supports the investment justification.

The Laramie County Sheriff's Department is requesting funding for thirty-two mobile radios. This project falls under the Interoperable Emergency Communications section as it provides operational support to the department. Radio equipment will be compatible and interoperable with surrounding systems and will meet the SAFECOM guidance and align with the Statewide Communication Interoperability Plan (SCIP). Within the 2018 THIRA Operational Communications was established as a gap in Laramie County. We ranked communications as a high priority and this includes having the capability and capacity to coordinate with all agencies on scene. Communication needs are critical to the success and efficiencies of a department and when that department is law enforcement it is critical.

Describer threats and hazards that create the need.

Mobile radios are an essential component to providing protection within Laramie County and to ensure the Sheriff's Department meets all of the capabilities needed to mitigate a catastrophic event. Our current mobile radios have had a long service life, and Motorola has discontinued service support for these radios effective fall of 2018. Our department needs to be able to replace these radios with new mobile radios that are WyoLink compatible and Project 25 capable. Without proper radio communication our department is unable to provide on scene security or operational coordination.

Explain this project's dual applicability to all-hazard events (manmade and natural hazards):

The mobile radios can be used on all scenes. The cause of the threat/scene is not a prohibiting factor for the equipment to be utilized. These radios are also a deployable asset that could be requested and used throughout the state if needed.

Identify portions of the THIRA and SPR that the project will address.

Our request of mobile radios addresses the Laramie County THIRA with examination of the Operational Communications, Operational Coordination and On-Scene Security, Protection and Law Enforcement capabilities. The THIRA confirmed our known gap in operational communications, as the

technology is continually evolving. The mobile radios would facilitate a quicker response on scene and an un-interrupted communication link with other responding agencies. The mobile radio units will be installed in Laramie County Sheriff Department vehicles and will provide our community partners with a collaborative response effort.

How will this project increase capability or reduce vulnerabilities in protecting, preventing, responding, or recovering from an act of terrorism?

The proposed project will increase our office's safety and capacity to communicate with other officers and agencies both off and on scene. The new mobile radio equipment will increase capabilities across the board and will reduce officer vulnerabilities. The radios will facilitate proper protection, prevention, and response to all scenes to include acts of terrorism.

Provide justification on how the project will be maintained, supported, and sustained.

The Laramie County Sheriff's Department will assume all responsibility for the maintenance of the equipment to keep it operational and ready for use internally and externally by MOU partners. The requested equipment can easily be sustained by Laramie County for future operations. Our request would assist the Laramie County Sheriff's Department and the State in operational communications with WyoLink compatible radios that are P25 compliant.

Describe existing capability levels.

The Laramie County Sheriff's Department currently has older mobile radios that are no longer supported by Motorola. We utilize our deputy vehicles (with mobile radio) for off and on scene communications between various agencies involved. A gap that was identified in the THIRA was communications and project will address the Laramie County Sheriff's Department insufficiency. The project will bring the department into full compliance with the WyoLink communications system and completes the interoperable communication needs of the Sheriff's Department.

Please provide an overview of the trainings, exercises, real events, or other needs assessments that have identified this as a gap (included the cause of the gap).

The Laramie County Sheriff's Department participates in all area trainings and exercises. We have been highly involved in all planning and training efforts coordinated by our EMA office. We participate in all area exercises, trainings, table tops and planning efforts with LCCC, refinery, CFD and the State. When we participated in the 2018 THIRA, not having adequate mobile radio communication capability was a concern. In our THIRA we identified Operational Communications as a gap and made it a high priority. This gap is primarily caused by aging equipment.

How will this project reduce capability gaps?

If funded, the mobile radios will allow our office and authorized users to use the equipment on or off scene. These mobile radios will support our law enforcement efforts within the community and provide extended coverage and access to the Combined Communication Center. Our request supports the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security's mission to comply with the SAFECOM Guidance for Emergency Communications and aligns

with the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan. Mobile radios will be programmed to interface with State WyoLink requirements, allowing multi-jurisdictional usage. The mobile radios will provide the Laramie County Sheriff's Department with enhanced operational communications.

- A grant award is anticipated to occur in October 2019. At this time we will establish a budget and accounting line items to prepare for the grant. After funding has been awarded we will go out for a formal quote process. We are anticipating this will be completed by the end of December 2019.
- We plan on receiving quotes the beginning of February 2020 and at that time all quotes will be evaluated and a vendor recommended to the County Commissioners. Once this process is complete we will be moving forward with our selected vendor to purchase the equipment. We are allocating two months for this process.
- 3. Beginning in April of 2020 we anticipate receiving the equipment, and having it properly installed. We are estimating three months for this process to allow for fluctuating shipping and installation time. At the time of the equipment arriving we will inventory and sticker all radios.
- 4. Our final milestone will be to close out and finalize all grant items for the grant from Wyoming Office of Homeland Security. We anticipate this concluding around July 30, 2020.

The sworn Sheriff's Department staff is part of the critical infrastructure protection for Laramie County. They serve as the security providers for the Detention Center as well as for the courthouse and other county government buildings located at the county government complex in downtown Cheyenne. Typically, they will be the first responders should there be a security response needed in the city or county courtrooms or in the event of a critical incident in the county government complex; and typically they will be responding before law enforcement is called to, or arrives at, the complex. Having proper communications is vital, and updating mobile radio capability to be in line with WyoLink and the county communications center is key to providing community protection.

The Laramie County Sheriff's Department will train deputies on the proper use of the requested mobile radios. These radios will be maintained by our department for the lifespan of the equipment, typically ten years.

'A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS), ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, and local governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity;

WHEREAS, the collective input and guidance from all Federal, State, and local homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, and local emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management it is critical that Federal, State, and local organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, uniform standards for planning, training, and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters;

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the county's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local agency readiness, maintain first responder safety, and streamline incident management processes,

WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various city/county incident management activities, including current emergency management training programs; and

WHEREAS, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY that the National Incident Management System (NIMS) is established as the County standard for incident management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Jeanine West, or her successor in the position of Director of EMA, is appointed as agent of the Laramie County Board of Commissioners to execute and submit items and certifications for NIMS compliance.
