A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A RATIFIED GRANT APPLICATION TO THE WYOMING OFFICE OF HOMELAND SECURITY FOR THE FFY 2023 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (SHSP), ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING TO REQUEST FUNDING FOR THE LARAMIE COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$23,000.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF: REQUESTED FUNDS WILL BE USED FOR THE PURCHASE OF A THERMAL IMAGING CAMERA SYSTEM TO BE INSTALLED ON THE JOINT OWNED SNO-CAT.

The Thermal Imaging Camera System request addresses the THIRA within the areas of mass search and rescue operations; screening, search and detection; and operational coordination. Our request combines the areas of planning, prevention, protection, response and recovery into one.

The THIRA confirmed our known gap in mass search and rescue operations and operational coordination, as the technology available is continually evolving. The Thermal Imaging Camera System will facilitate a quicker response on scene with other responding agencies in a coordinated effort. The equipment provides our community partners with a collaborative response effort.

This project has the capability to coordinate the prevention, protection, response and recovery of any event to include acts of terrorism. During a terroristic event, the Thermal Imaging Camera System could assist in locating heat signatures during search and rescue operations related to the incident.

After funding has been awarded, we will follow the Laramie County Procurement Policies on purchasing equipment. We are anticipating this will be completed by the end of December 2023.

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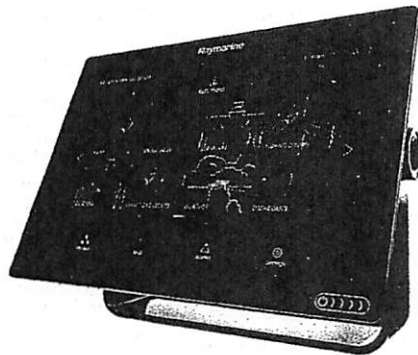
