The local Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) and Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) work together to provide volunteer services for various assignments during a disaster. One of the services is to provide communications to and from various locations paramount to the incident operations. The project being requested would be for the purchase of new radio equipment used for Go-Kits available for deployment to be used by ARES and ARES/CERT volunteers for operations as well as upgrades to the Wyoming DMR Project equipment for communications links between sites.

The Go-Kits will be capable of using FM, DMR and data communications to send messages via radio should normal communications be affected or overloaded during a disaster. Examples of uses for the equipment would be for shelters, damage assessments and search & rescue operations.

The Wyoming DMR Project is a network of repeaters that link a large portion of the state similar to the WyoLink system. The original project was designed to provide an alternate route for communications for ARES/RACES operations during disasters. Some of the sites use an internet link through microwave antennas. The equipment purchased for this project will be used upgrade this type of equipment to provide a more reliable link between repeaters.
