We are requesting funding to purchase two powered gurneys and eight full respirators with belt attachments (PAPR systems) for fatality management. The Laramie County Coroner's Office has seen a significant increase in their caseload over the last year, especially due to COVID-19. The purchase of this equipment is an essential component to the operations at the Coroner's Office. This request incorporates two powered gurneys and up to eight PAPR Systems with hood to protect our staff. The gurneys are to provide easy transportation and movement of deceased individuals. The PAPR's are an air-purifying respirator that creates airflow inside of a hood for protection. These respirator hoods offer greater protection to aerosolized pathogens that can be encountered on a scene or in the lab.

This request supports Laramie County's mass fatality management plan by enhancing availability of proper equipment. This equipment can be deployable and used countywide and can be loaded into the Mass Casualty Trailer.

Our request addresses the Laramie County THIRA, with examination of the fatality management services capability. The THIRA confirmed our known gap in this area within response and recovery efforts. The power gurneys and respirators would facilitate an efficient process for transporting bodies from the field to the morgue. This would be especially important during a mass casualty event. Our THIRA identified body recovery and mortuary services as a gap, due to limited capabilities to

With the increased uncertainty and large volumes of individuals having COVID-19 upon their death as well as other infectious diseases, it is has become increasingly important to ensure our coroner and investigators are properly protected. PAPR systems will be critical to ensuring that our team can

adequately respond to all deaths within the community.

The proposed project will increase our office's ability and capacity to remove and transport bodies and remains from the scene to the morgue. This ability is particularly useful in terrorist or CBRNE events where the potential for a large number of deceased may exist. The response and removal of bodies will be precise and efficient with the requested equipment, allowing for expedited cleanup and investigation of scene. The respirators are essential to protecting staff in both natural and manmade disasters that can cause death. All equipment would be purchased following NIOSH guidelines and certifications. Appropriate breathing apparatus is important to responding to acts of terrorism, while maintaining the safety of responders.

If our request is funded, The Laramie County Coroner's Office will assume all responsibility for the maintenance of the equipment to keep it operational and ready for use internally and externally by MOU partners. The requested equipment will be sustained by Laramie County for future operations. Our request would assist Laramie County and the state in fatality management.

For the belt mounted hood PAPR respirators we would need approximately \$2,546 per hood for a total of \$20,368 for the eight belt-mounted hoods. The individual unit prices are depend upon sizes. For the purpose of this application, we went with the highest amount for our calculations.


