A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RATIFIED SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE WYOMING OFFICE OF HOMELAND SECURITY FOR THE FFY 2022 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (SHSP), ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING TO REQUEST FUNDING FOR THE LARAMIE COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$131,232.00.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF: REQUESTED FUNDS WILL BE USED FOR THE PURCHASE OF THREE BOMB SUITS FOR THE LARAMIE COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security receives FFY 2022 SHSP funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and;

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security distributes a portion of these FFY 2022 SHSP funds to Wyoming Counties and;

WHEREAS, the Laramie County Board of Commissioners is eligible to apply for and receive FFY 2022 SHSP funds for the Laramie County Sheriff's Department and;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of Laramie County desires to participate in the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSP) by sponsoring this grant application to assist in financing the Sheriff's Department; and

The Laramie County Sheriff's Office/Cheyenne Police Department Joint Public Safety Bomb Team (EOD) is in need of three EOD 10E bomb suit with all the necessary attachments. The team consist of 5 FBI certified Public Safety Bomb Technicians. The EOD bomb suits protect the bomb technicians from fragments, overpressure and heat in the event a device should explode. The team's current EOD bomb suits are expired and should be taken out of service. The requested EOD 10E bomb suits are the same suits the FBI uses when certifying and recertifying Public Safety Bomb Suits. In 2021, the team responded to 15 suspicious packages and/or devices.

Hazardous materials are identified in our THIRA as a leading threat to Laramie County. Our THIRA and SPR discuss on scene security, situational assessments along with detection. Under the core capability of Environmental Response/Health & Safety, we identified this area as a gap in our THIRA. We do not have the resources to respond to a catastrophic event without substantial assistance from outside agencies. Securing proper equipment will aid in reducing this gap.

In the event the Joint Public Safety Bomb Team were to respond to an area such as the Wyoming State Capital building for an suspicious item, the up to date bomb suits would give the bomb technicians the best chance of surviving an explosion. The current bomb suits are expired, outdated, and put technicians at risk. The new suits would give each bomb technician the confidence to perform their duties knowing they are fully protected.

15. All projects under this grant must have a nexus to terrorism. Please describe how your project relates to acts of terrorism.

Often time's terrorists (domestic and foreign) use explosive devices to cause harm to infrastructure or create deaths. This is where the Public Safety Bomb Team is a critical part of these types of threats. In our area of responsibility, we have several government buildings to include the Wyoming State Capital building. There is also a large water reservoir that supplies electricity to the power grid by using a dam to generate the power. These are some examples of structures or infrastructure that could be voluble to acts of terrorism. The Laramie County Sheriff's Office/Cheyenne Police Department Joint Public Safety Bomb Team (EOD) is responsible for region 7 of Wyoming, which consists of Laramie, Goshen, and Platte Counties. The team also assists other bomb teams as requested and the team is on-call 24 hours a day. The requested bomb suits would primarily be used to respond to potential or actual terrorist threats.

The requested EOD 10E bomb suits are covered under a company warranty and the ongoing maintenance is minimum. The suits are stored in an enclosed case and inspected on a monthly basis. Laramie County will assume all responsibility for the sustainment of the requested equipment in partnership with the Joint Public Safety Bomb Team.
