A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RATIFIED SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE WYOMING OFFICE OF HOMELAND SECURITY FOR THE FFY 2022 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (SHSP), ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING TO REQUEST FUNDING FOR LARAMIE COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$15,000.

**WHEREAS**, the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security receives FFY 2022 SHSP funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and;

**WHEREAS**, the Laramie County Board of Commissioners is eligible to apply for and receive FFY 2022 SHSP funds for Laramie County EMA and;

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of Laramie County desires to participate in the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSP) by sponsoring this grant application to assist in financing the Emergency Management Department; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of Laramie County has been provided with preliminary cost estimates and information on this project; and

This project falls under the Community Resilience section, as it assists in the response and recovery from a threat or incident. The Laramie County CERT volunteers can be deployed across the county to help with proper response and recovery efforts. Within the 2020/2021 THIRA, our county discussed logistics and situational management and the ability for community coordination and outreach efforts during manmade or natural hazards. The requested gear will assist our county and others in providing proper supplies and tools to carry out the mission and services of CERT. Proper equipment and supplies is critical for volunteers being able to effectively respond to threats within the community.

Our request addresses the Laramie County THIRA with examination of community resilience, operational and community coordination, and proper situational assessments. The THIRA confirmed our known gap in this area with response and recovery efforts. The tools, supplies and gear that we are requesting for the CERT trailer and team will provide the County with a reliable and flexible asset for community response efforts. CERT volunteers provide agency partners with a collaborative response effort for many natural or manmade incidents. Our THIRA identified the need for mobilizing resources and one of our best resources is the community itself. This request also allows for us to purchase preparedness outreach items for the whole community events that CERT participates in throughout the year. Our volunteers' increased involvement with community events over this past year has also increased our need for more community information resources that the team can provide.

The proposed request will increase our county's ability and capacity to reach out to CERT volunteers for assistance in acts of

terrorism, where it is safe for non-first responders to assist. Our request is for medical supplies to replace outdated or expired items and replacing missing/expired/broken tools provided for volunteers to utilize while on scene. Additionally, we are requesting funds to purchase community outreach materials such as water bottles and preparedness literature. These outreach items will further the public's knowledge and awareness of emergency response efforts that are in place within Laramie County.

Laramie County will assume all responsibility for the maintenance of the equipment to keep it operational and ready for use internally and externally by CERT volunteers. The requested equipment can easily be sustained by Laramie County for future operations. All requested equipment will be stored in the Laramie County CERT trailer or in the Laramie County Emergency Management Office and will be easily accessible for use by volunteers. Our request will assist Laramie County with providing volunteers with the necessary tools and gear for proper response operations.

A grant award is anticipated to occur in October 2022. At this time, we will establish a budget and accounting line items to prepare for the grant. After funding has been awarded, we will go out for a formal bid process according to Laramie County Procurement Policies on requested equipment. We are anticipating this will be completed by the end of December 2022.

We plan to receive quotes the beginning of February 2023 and at that time all quotes will be evaluated and a vendor recommended. We will also be conducting research on the proposed supplies for proper fit into CERT operations. Once this



process is complete, we will be moving forward with our selected vendor to purchase the equipment. We are allocating three months for this process to end in April 2023.

Beginning in May of 2023, we anticipate receiving the equipment. We are estimating six months for this process to allow for fluctuating availability and shipping schedules. At the time of the equipment arriving we will inventory and sticker all items.

### Budget Narrative

Our request is comprised of three categories to bring the Laramie County CERT team back into full operational capacity. We are requesting money for community outreach supplies to include, but not limited to quick series pocket manuals, water bottles and gear not to exceed \$3,000. This will make everyday citizens aware of emergency response operations within Laramie County and the assets we have to help keep our community safe. Also, we are requesting funds to continue updating, replacing, and expanding our equipment inventory and storage capabilities in our various CERT response bags and trailers. We also have a need to replace non-sparking tools and associated equipment. For this portion of our request we are estimating \$12,000 in expenditures to ensure we have proper gear. Laramie County is continuing to expand its CERT program and is offering its CERT Basic Training at least twice a year along with other requested trainings from local groups. All purchases will follow the Laramie County Procurement Policy and will be stored and properly maintained by the County. By investing in our CERT volunteers, we will be addressing the following gaps identified in the THIRA to include operational coordination, situational assessments, logistics, mobilizing resources and providing community outreach management. Through these avenues, Laramie County will be able to better build and sustain community resilience. The AEL codes that we will be using to support our purchases are the following: 21GN-00-CCEQ, 11RE-00-RFEX, 11RE-00-RFNC, and 21CR-00-MED1.

Laser transmitters are attached to each individual and vehicle weapon system and accurately replicate actual ranges and lethality of the specific weapon systems.
