

SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAM AGREEMENT
between
LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING and CHEYENNE COMMUNITY DRUG ABUSE
TREATMENT COUNCIL (D/B/A "PATHFINDER")

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Laramie County, Wyoming, P.O. Box 608, Cheyenne, Wyoming 82003-0608, ("COUNTY") and Pathfinder, 1920 Thomas Avenue, Cheyenne Wyoming 82001 ("CONTRACTOR"). The parties agree as follows:

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is for CONTRACTOR to provide substance abuse treatment services, drug testing, and other treatment related services, for the Laramie County DUI Court program participants.

II. TERM

This Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2018, and shall remain in full force and effect until June 30, 2019.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF COUNTY

COUNTY shall pay CONTRACTOR an amount not to exceed one hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$170,000.00). The total contract amount includes seven thousand five hundred dollars (7,500.00) to be used for national accreditation fees and expense and seven thousand, four hundred fifty-one dollars and sixty cents (7,451.60) to be used to for urinalysis kits and testing. All national accreditation and urinalysis testing expenses shall be billed separately from other services provided by CONTRACTOR under this agreement. Payment will be made monthly upon receipt of CONTRACTOR'S invoice to the COUNTY, or submission of other documentation certifying completion of the services, and upon review and approval by the Director of the Drug and DUI Court programs. No payment shall be made before the last signature is affixed to this Agreement. Payments shall be in accordance with Wyo. Stat. § 16-6-602 (as amended).

IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF CONTRACTOR

- A. CONTRACTOR shall provide and complete the services described in "Pathfinder Grant Proposal", a copy of which is retained in the Drug Court and DUI Court program office.
1. The CONTRACTOR agrees to maintain appropriate national accreditation for substance use disorders.
 2. The CONTRACTOR will maintain and provide as necessary an accreditation report for substance abuse disorder services resulting from the most recent accreditation visit.
 3. If accreditation occurs during the term of this agreement, the CONTRACTOR will provide a PDF copy of the accreditation report, Quality Improvement Plan (QIP), or any other accreditation related documents to the COUNTY.

4. The CONTRACTOR shall provide a PDF copy of the Annual Conformance to Quality Report (ACQR) and documentation the ACQR was accepted by the accrediting body to the COUNTY.
5. The CONTRACTOR shall provide a PDF copy of any ongoing communication of administrative issues, significant events, or correction action plans that may be required for accreditation to the COUNTY.
6. The CONTRACTOR agrees to meet the following Department of Health performance measurements;
 - (A) Provide an average of three and one-half (3.5) ancillary services or referrals per participant per month.
 - (B) Provide an average of five (5) treatment attendance contacts per participant per month.
7. The CONTRACTOR shall work with the Director of the Drug and DUI Court programs to address areas of concern as outlined in Attachment A.

B. CONTRACTOR agrees to retain all required records for three (3) years after the County makes final payment and all other matters relating to the Agreement are concluded. CONTRACTOR agrees to permit access by the COUNTY or any of its duly authorized representatives to any books, documents, papers and records of the CONTRACTOR which are directly pertinent to this specific Agreement for purposes including but not limited to audit, examination, excerpts, and transcriptions. It is agreed that finished or unfinished documents, data or reports, prepared by CONTRACTOR under this contract shall be considered the property of the COUNTY and upon completion of the services to be performed, or upon termination of this Agreement for cause, or for the convenience of the COUNTY, will be turned over to the COUNTY.

V. GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. Independent Contractor: The services to be performed by CONTRACTOR are those of an independent contractor and not as an employee of COUNTY. CONTRACTOR is not eligible for Laramie County Employee benefits and will be treated as an independent contractor for federal tax filing purposes. CONTRACTOR assumes responsibility for its personnel who provide services pursuant to this contract and will make all deductions required of employers by state, federal and local laws and shall maintain liability insurance for each of them. CONTRACTOR is free to perform the same or similar services for others.

B. Acceptance Not Waiver: COUNTY approval of the reports, and work or materials furnished hereunder shall not in any way relieve CONTRACTOR of responsibility for the technical accuracy of the work. COUNTY approval or acceptance of, or payment for, any of the services shall not be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this Agreement or of any cause of action arising out of the performance of this Agreement.

C. Termination: This Agreement may be terminated (a) by either party at any time for failure of the other party to comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement; (b) by either party, with thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other party; or (c) upon mutual written agreement by both parties.

D. Entire Agreement: This Agreement represent the entire and integrated agreement and understanding between the parties and supersede all prior negotiations, statements, representations and agreements, whether written or oral.

E. Assignment: Neither this Agreement, nor any rights or obligations hereunder shall be assigned or delegated by a party without the prior written consent of the other party.

F. Modification: This Agreement shall be modified only by a written agreement, duly executed by all parties hereto.

G. Invalidity: If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, or if the COUNTY is advised of any such actual or potential invalidity or unenforceability, such holding or advice shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof. It is the express intent of the parties that the provisions of this Agreement are fully severable.

H. Applicable Law and Venue: The parties mutually understand and agree this Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Wyoming. If any dispute arises between the parties from or concerning this Agreement or the subject matter hereof, any suit or proceeding at law or in equity shall be brought in the District Court of the State of Wyoming, First Judicial District, sitting at Cheyenne, Wyoming. The foregoing provisions of this paragraph are agreed by the parties to be a material inducement to CONTRACTOR and to COUNTY in executing this Agreement. This provision is not intended nor shall it be construed to waive COUNTY's governmental immunity as provided in this Agreement.

I. Contingencies: CONTRACTOR certifies and warrants no gratuities, kick-backs or contingency fees were paid in connection with this Agreement, nor were any fees, commissions, gifts or other considerations made contingent upon the award of this Agreement.

J. Discrimination: All parties agree they will not discriminate against any person who performs work under the terms and conditions of this Agreement because of race, color, gender, creed, handicapping condition, or national origin.

K. ADA Compliance: All parties agree they will not discriminate against a qualified individual with disability, pursuant to a law as set forth in the Americans With Disabilities Act, P.L. 101-336, 42 U.S.C. § 12101, *et seq.*, and/or any properly promulgated rules and regulations relating thereto.

L. Governmental/Sovereign Immunity: COUNTY does not waive its Governmental/ Sovereign Immunity, as provided by any applicable law including W.S. § 1-39-101 *et seq.*, by entering into this Agreement. Further, COUNTY fully retains all immunities and defenses provided by law with regard to any action, whether in tort, contract or any other theory of law, based on this Agreement.

M. Indemnification: To the fullest extent permitted by law, CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify and hold harmless COUNTY, its elected and appointed officials, employees and volunteers from any and all liability for injuries, damages, claims, penalties, actions, demands or expenses arising from or in connection with work performed by or on behalf of CONTRACTOR for COUNTY except to the extent liability is caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of COUNTY or its employees. CONTRACTOR shall carry liability insurance sufficient to cover its obligations under this provision, including all insurance required in the attached Exhibit 1: "Insurance Requirements," and shall file certificates of such insurance satisfactory to the County and approved by the County.

N. Third Parties: The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary, and this Agreement shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Agreement shall operate only between the parties to the Agreement, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement.

O. Conflict of Interest: COUNTY and CONTRACTOR affirm, to their knowledge, no CONTRACTOR employee has any personal beneficial interest whatsoever in the agreement described herein. No staff member of CONTRACTOR, compensated either partially or wholly with funds from this Agreement, shall engage in any conduct or activity which would constitute a conflict of interest relative to this Agreement.

P. Force Majeure: Neither party shall be liable to perform under this Agreement if such failure arises out of causes beyond control, and without the fault or the negligence of said party. Such causes may include, but are not restricted to, Act of God or the public enemy, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, freight embargoes, and unusually severe weather. In every case, however, a failure to perform must be beyond the control and without the fault or the negligence of said party.

Q. Limitation on Payment: COUNTY's payment obligation is conditioned upon the availability of funds which are appropriated or allocated for the payment of this obligation. If funds are not allocated and available for the continuance of the services and equipment provided by CONTRACTOR the Agreement may be terminated by COUNTY at the end of the period for which funds are available. COUNTY shall notify CONTRACTOR at the earliest possible time of the services which will or may be effected by a shortage of funds. At the earliest possible time means at least thirty (30) days before the shortage will affect payment of claims, if COUNTY knows of the shortage at least thirty (30) days in advance. No penalty shall accrue to COUNTY in the event this provision is exercised, and COUNTY shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this provision. If the available funds dedicated to this agreement are depleted prior to the expiration date of this agreement as noted in Section II, the CONTRACTOR agrees to continue to provide services to DUI Court participants as specified in this agreement and in the CONTRACTOR's RFP until the expiration of this agreement or until new funds become available. Any additional services provided to the COUNTY in accordance to this Agreement, which remains uncompensated at the end of the fiscal year shall be documented and provided to the Director of the Drug and DUI Court programs to be used as in-kind donations in future funding applications.

R. Notices: All notices required and permitted under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given, if and when deposited in the U.S. Mail, properly stamped and addressed to the party for whom intended at such parties' address listed herein, or when personally delivered personally to such party. A party may change its address for notice hereunder by giving written notice to the other party.

S. Compliance with Laws: CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations and ordinances, whether Federal, State or Local.

T. Agreement Controls: Where a conflict exists or arises between any provision or condition of the this Agreement, and any provisions and conditions set forth in its attachments this Agreement shall control.

Exhibit 1
Insurance Requirements

Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder and the results of that work by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

MINIMUM SCOPE AND LIMIT OF INSURANCE

Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

1. **Commercial General Liability (CGL):** Insurance Services Office Form CG 00 01 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products and completed operations, property damage, bodily injury and personal and advertising injury with limits no less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.

2. **Automobile Liability:** ISO Form Number CA 00 01 covering any auto (Code 1), or if Contractor has no owned autos, hired, (Code 8) and non-owned autos (Code 9), with limit no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.

3. **Workers' Compensation:** as required by the State of Wyoming with Statutory Limits, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limit of no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.

4. **Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions):** Insurance appropriate to the Contractor's profession with limit no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence or claim, \$2,000,000 aggregate. *(If applicable – see footnote next page)*

If the contractor maintains higher limits than the minimums shown above, the Entity requires and shall be entitled to coverage for the higher limits maintained by the contractor. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the Entity.

Other Insurance Provisions

The insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

Additional Insured Status

The Entity, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers are to be covered as additional insured's on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form

of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance (at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or if not available, through the addition of both CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 if a later edition is used).

Primary Coverage

For any claims related to this contract, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the Entity, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance of self-insurance maintained by the Entity, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

Notice of Cancellation

Each insurance policy required above shall provide that coverage shall not be cancelled, except with notice of Entity.

Waiver of Subrogation

Contractor hereby grants to Entity a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of said Contractor may acquire against the Entity by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Contractor agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the Entity has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer.

Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Entity. The Entity may require the Contractor to purchase coverage with a lower deductible or retention or provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense expenses within the retention.

Acceptability of Insurers

Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the Entity.

Claims Made Policies (note – should be applicable only to professional liability, see below)

If any of the required policies provide claims-made coverage:

1. The Retroactive Date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work.
2. Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided ***for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract work.***
3. If coverage is cancelled or non-renewed, and not replaced ***with another claims-made policy form with a Retroactive Date prior to*** the contract effective date, the contractor must

purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of *five (5)* years after completion of work.

Verification of Coverage

Contractor shall furnish the Entity with original certificates and amendatory endorsements or copies of the applicable policy language effecting coverage required by this clause. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved the Entity before work commences. However, failure to obtain the required documents prior to the work beginning shall not waive the Contractor's obligation to provide them. The Entity reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by these specifications, at any time.

Special Risks or Circumstances

Entity reserves the right to modify these requirements, including limits, based on the nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage, or other special circumstances.

Re: Laramie County DUI Court Treatment Contract Bid

Dear Rick;

On behalf of the DUI Court Team, I want to thank you for submitting a bid for the treatment provider contract. Your bid was selected by the DUI Court Team to provide substance abuse treatment and mental health services for the DUI Court participants.

Likewise, I want thank you for meeting with Chris, Leslie and I to discuss areas of concern that the DUI Court Team would like to address with Pathfinder and your willingness to address those concerns. Per our conversation, the DUI Court Team requests Pathfinder agree to the following:

1. The DUI Court Team strongly encourages Pathfinder to update the treatment curriculum used in IOP treatment and request that Pathfinder provide regular updates to the Team as to the status of the update process. (Drug/DUI Court best practice guidelines indicate a direct benefit to participants when programs update their curriculum on a regular basis because it generally improves the quality of treatment).
2. Provide Relapse Prevention Plans on all DUI Court participants to the DUI Court Team.
3. Provide to the DUI Court Team the curriculum and/or treatment manual that is used in the male and female IOP treatment programs.
4. Incorporate the findings and recommendations of the Computerized Assessment and Referral System (CARS) evaluation into the case plans for all DUI Court participants. Pathfinder shall provide appropriate treatment services in regards to CARS when necessary, or make formal referrals as appropriate.
5. Work with the DUI Court Team to create a formal relationship with Healthworks, Inc., or other medical care providers as necessary, to establish a Medicated Assisted Treatment (MAT) program specifically targeted at opioid addiction.
6. Work with Team to either (1) provide family and couples counseling, or (2) create relationships with organizations in town for referrals for family and couples counseling at reasonable cost. (Best practices dictate we should be able to refer or wraparound services for participants).
7. Effective July 1, 2018, Pathfinder will no longer require DUI Court participants to provide proof of AA attendance.

8. Make sure that the 24 hour line is always available to participants. (Participants have stated that it is difficult to get through to a person when groups are in session.)
9. Contact DUI Court Team to see if additional information may be helpful before updating treatment assessments. (There is a misconception concerning a 3 relapses or using events and you are out of IOP rule, which may or may not be occurring).
10. Update movie watching policy with the curriculum updates requested above; or remove movie watching all together. (Common participant complaints revolve around movie watching vs. receiving actual treatment. This may be an unwarranted complaint, but we must take seriously participant comments).
11. Work with DUI Court to develop treatment specific contingency management plan. (DUI Court may not be able to provide all the positive reinforcement and incentives necessary to administer a good contingency management for your program).

The DUI Court program would not have enjoyed the success it has without Pathfinder and the DUI Court Team still feels that together we will continue to make this program great. However, we also need to be sure to stay current with best practice strategies and evidence-based practices. It takes teamwork to maintain the number one spot we have in the state of Wyoming. We continue to set the standard for DUI Courts in Wyoming. Let's set the bar as high as we can!
