Wendy Volk, Cheyenne Regional Air Focus Team, presented an update on air service at Cheyenne Regional Airport. 15. PUBLIC HEARING regarding a Subdivision Permit and Plat for Destin Heights, located in a portion of Section 24, T. 14 N., R. 66 W., of the 6th P.M., Laramie County, WY.

Brad Emmons, Planning and Development Director, presented a Subdivision Permit & Plat application for Steil Surveying, on behalf of MAX Partners, LLC, c/o Steve Prescott. The application was submitted in order to subdivide approximately 100 acres into 19 single-family residential tracts averaging 5.25 acres. The subject property is unplatted and is surrounded by rural residential and agricultural properties of varying acreage of predominately 5-acre tracts. Casey Palma, Steil Surveying, agent for the applicant, stated that City planners and MPO thought it was important to acknowledge the previously platted road reservation and requested a dedicated public connection be provided. Mr. Palma noted that a reasonable compromise was worked out with the landowners. Based on evidence provided, staff recommended approval with adoption of findings of fact a & b and the following four conditions:

Road construction standards shall be submitted and approved by the County Engineer and Public Works; a private road maintenance agreement shall be approved by County Public Works and the County Engineer prior to plat recordation; proof of DEQ approval in the form of a "Non-Adverse Recommendation" shall be provided prior to plat recordation; and work out Lupine Trail connection with government agencies and modify plat to meet agreement. Chairman Heath opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. Donald A. Beckle said the subdivision should be reevaluated because his property requires at least 6.2 acres to do any development and if the applicant is allowed to go to 5.2 acres, then precedent should be set for the total area. Mr. Emmons said if Mr. Beckle came to the planning office and had his property rezoned to AR, he would be allowed to have 5.25 acres as well. Seth Lloyd, City of Cheyenne Planning, made clarification points about the City's review of county plats within one mile of city limits. Hearing no further PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Heath closed the hearing.

A motion was made by Commissioner Holmes, seconded by Vice Chairman Ash, that this agenda item be approved with four conditions and to adopt the findings of fact a and b of the staff report. The motion carried by the following vote:
