Project Description

Project Justification: Community Resilience

Briefly describe the project and how it supports the investment justification.

The Laramie County Emergency Management Agency is requesting funding for our Emergency Operations Center. The equipment located within our EOC is ten to eleven years old and needs replaced. We are requesting funds to exchange the three smart boards with touchscreen displays. Our request includes the accessories and installation. The current EOC uses a smart board system to display real time information for emergencies and events. This equipment was installed when the building was built and is almost eleven years old. The technology used in this system can no longer be updated or upgraded and parts are non-existent or extremely hard to find, not to mention costly. We would like to replace the equipment with modern technology that is available today.

Describer threats and hazards that create the need.

The EOC serves as an operational headquarters and central command for Laramie County events. The facility is open to all emergency personnel and elected officials. The EOC serves as a space where information can be collected and analyzed to make decisions for appropriate actions on scene. The space located at EMA provides all five functional components of an EOC to assist with planning, operations and other logistical components. The space is not scene or hazard specific and serves multiple purposes to properly address all threats and hazards that may arise within Laramie County.

Explain this project's dual applicability to all-hazard events (manmade and natural hazards):

The Laramie County Emergency Operations Center can be and is used for all types of hazardous events. The EOC provides Laramie County officials and operational staff a place to gather to logistically manage an event. The EOC provides dual applicability to all hazardous events to include manmade and natural.

Identify portions of the THIRA and SPR that the project will address.

The EOC project addresses the THIRA within the areas of operational coordination, situational assessment and logistics. Our request combines the areas of planning, prevention, protection, response and recovery into

one. All of these capabilities can be synchronized through the use of the EOC facility. One standard location such as an EOC, can provide decision makers with relevant information in relation to the hazard for them to be able to make appropriate decisions. The EOC also allows for a coordinated operational structure that integrates all stakeholders in properly allocating resources and the operation of the hazard or event.

How will this project increase capability or reduce vulnerabilities in protecting, preventing, responding, or recovering from an act of terrorism?

This project has the capability to coordinate the prevention, protection, response and recovery of any event to include acts of terrorism. The EOC is a command post that allows decision makers to come together in one location with appropriate resources and technical equipment to manage the event or hazard at hand. Our request of upgraded touchscreen displays will greatly aid in the ability for quick communication and operational coordination within Laramie County.

Provide justification on how the project will be maintained, supported, and sustained.

The Laramie County Emergency Management Agency will maintain and support the equipment that is being requested along with the Laramie County IT Department. This equipment will also be inventoried and tracked for compliance purposes. Our request of updated touchscreen displays is sustainable for operations within the EOC and the EMA department as a whole.

Describe existing capability levels.

The Laramie County Emergency Management Agency houses an Emergency Operations Center that is original to the building. The equipment that is located within the EOC itself is approximately ten to eleven years old and is in need of replacement. We are currently using three smartboards that are nearing the end of their lifecycle. The smartboards have been a tremendous asset to the EOC and allow for various operations to be completed in one shared space.

Please provide an overview of the trainings, exercises, real events, or other needs assessments that have identified this as a gap (included the cause of the gap).

Our agency is highly involved in all local trainings, exercises, and real events that are identified within the community. We regularly work with such agencies as the refinery, LCCC, FE Warren Air Force Base and smaller businesses within the community. We have partnered with these agencies on the annual THIRA plan and through this; we have identified operational communications as a gap. Technology is continually changing demanding that operations stay consistent with this growth for appropriate and timely response. We consider the EOC an instrumental component to emergency operations within Laramie County. The funds for the EOC project we are requesting will help us meet this gap.

How will this project reduce capability gaps?

The EOC Enhancement project will help our agency to reduce the gaps in operational communication and coordination. By having the proper equipment in place we can provide immediate resources to decision makers within the room and at events or hazards. The new touchscreens will ensure that our facility can serve as an EOC for Laramie County well into the

future.

 and accounting line items to prepare for the grant. After funding has been awarded, we will
 request quotes following the Laramie County procurement policies. We are anticipating this will
 be completed by the end of December 2019.
- 2. We anticipate receiving quotes in the beginning of January 2020 and at that time quotes will be evaluated and a vendor(s) selected. We are allocating three months for this process to occur.
- 3. Beginning in April of 2020, we anticipate receiving the equipment, conducting inventory and placing asset stickers on the items. We will also schedule the installation of the equipment. We are allowing three months for this process to permit for fluctuating shipping and installation times. We anticipate being completed with this milestone the first of July 2020.
- 4. Our final milestone will be to close out and finalize all grant items for the grant from the Wyoming Office of Homeland Security. We anticipate this concluding around the end of July 2020.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS), ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY, WYOMING

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, and local governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity;

WHEREAS, the collective input and guidance from all Federal, State, and local homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, and local emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management it is critical that Federal, State, and local organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, uniform standards for planning, training, and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters;

WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the county's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local agency readiness, maintain first responder safety, and streamline incident management processes.

WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various city/county incident management activities, including current emergency management training programs; and

WHEREAS, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF LARAMIE COUNTY that the National Incident Management System (NIMS) is established as the County standard for incident management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Jeanine West, or her successor in the position of Director of EMA, is appointed as agent of the Laramie County Board of Commissioners to execute and submit items and certifications for NIMS compliance.
