WHAT WILL THIS ACCOMPLISH:

- Implementation of FY19 Salary Survey
- Decrease cost of dependents health care
- Long term projects able to be completed
- No use of Operations & Maintenance funds to balance the budget – first year since FY07
- Operation & Maintenance funds used for emergencies



Salary Survey Results

- Research and results based on job titles and job descriptions
- Comparator entities are selected per job title – local, regional or national
- 68% of employees will see a salary adjustment in the fall of FY20
- 32% that do not see a salary adjustment will receive merit increases based on annual performance evaluations



Medical and Dental Health Coverage

- Now in line with county, city and state government – will assist with retention
- Employees were paying 65% of the cost of the premium for dependent coverage
- FY20 they pay only 15% for dependent coverage
- The budget also now has funds to anticipate other eligible employees participating



Major Projects

- Elmo (Microfilm & fiche scanner) will be replaced –
 13 year old equipment
- Cover for space between entry from parking lot and staff entrance to building where door is being damaged
- New servers for one of the divisions
- Replacement of a fifth of all computers
- Digital signage for Branches and Café
- Upgrades to bookmobile internet connectivity
