6. Briefly describe the project and how it supports the Investment Justification

The Laramie County Sheriff's Department is requesting funding for a bomb (explosives) K-9, associated training and travel costs under the IED/terrorism response investment justification. The department currently has five K9s, three of them being trained in narcotics detection, apprehension & tracking, one single purpose narcotics assigned to detention and one K9 in explosive detection. The requested K9 will have the ability to assist with meeting the identified capability gaps within the THIRA, to include on-scene security and protection, situational assessment, attribution, along with explosive detection. The department already has a budget for maintaining the canine's health and wellbeing along with proper vehicle accommodations to include (Hot and Pop) components. The K9 will join the existing team at the department and will also be available for response efforts under existing Memorandum of Understandings with other departments and the State of Wyoming.

7. Explain this project's dual applicability to all-hazard events (man-made and natural hazards)

Our project is an important component to man-made hazards specifically. The requested K9 will be trained to respond to explosive/bomb threat situations. The Laramie County Sheriff's Department has other equipment and resources to assist with natural hazard events.

8. Identify portions of the THIRA or SPR that the project will address

Our project will address items identified within the Laramie County 2019/2020 THIRA, to include protective security measures, inderdiction & disruption of hazards, and screening search and detection to identify and locate threats. A K9 specifically trained in explosive detection will help the county and community with terrorist prevention efforts. It has been found in research "that no device is as accurate, fast, sensitive, mobile, flexible and durable as a well-trained dog/handler team" (Explosive Detection Dogs-princeton.edu).

The importance of quick and efficient explosive detection is increasingly important with current civil unrest. The K9 will be an asset to the county and state for explosive detection to aid in the main goal of preserving life and property.

9. How will this project increase capability or reduce vulnerabilities in protecting, preventing, responding, or recovering from an act of terrorism?

The requested K9 has the potential to reduce acts of physical violence within the community through the means of locating IEDs and other explosives. The trained K9 will assist the Laramie County Sheriffs Department with protecting, preventing and responding to an act of terrorism through the detection of explosives. The physical presence of a K9 also serves as a deterrent to potential acts of violence. The Laramie County Sheriff K9s work in conjunction with other agencies such as the Wyoming Highway Patrol, UW Police, Homeland Security, City of Cheyenne Police and other agencies upon request for sweeps of events, buildings and scenes. K9s serve as a critical resource to quickly locate threats, immediately reducing vulnerabilities and the prevention of dangerous situations. A K9 can be utilized more effectively than ten officers, they can travel and clear areas quicker, and provide keen tracking abilities.

10. Provide justification on how the project will be maintained, supported, and sustained

The Laramie County Sheriff's Department will take all responsibility for insuring the health and safety of a K9 if funded. The department budgets and provides healthcare, equipment, transportation needs and additional training for K9s and their handlers. The K9 will be incorporated into the departments operations and all additional expenses associated with the animal will be covered and supported.

14. Describe existing capability levels

The department currently has five K9s and only one is an explosive detection canine. With the usage of K9s at community events such as Frontier Days, parades, gatherings, and political events the necessity for more than one trained explosive K9 team is critical to insuring the safety of participants and property. Our department utilizes our one explosive K9, but for large events or spaces, we have to rely upon our other partners. These partnerships can take time to coordinate and bring together. The UW Police and the City of Chevenne Police Department currently do not have explosive canines, we would have to rely on the Wyoming Highway Patrol, and other partners located in Colorado.

15. Please provide an overview of the trainings, exercises, real events, or other needs assessments that have identified this as a gap (include the cause of the gap).

The Laramie County Sheriff's Department participates in all trainings and exercises within the community in coordination with emergency management. Our K9 teams have worked several events throughout the years to include all parade sweeps, legislative protection, working at Frontier Park each year for Frontier Days and other calls associated with security at large gatherings. Our K9s participated in the Capitol grand reopening in conducting building and perimeter sweeps for two days. Recently, our second explosive detection canine was retired, leaving the department with only one trained canine for explosive detection duties.

16. How will this project reduce capability gaps?

Our requested project will allow the department to bring an additional explosive canine team to the community. The K9 team will be able to assist all partnering agencies locally and throughout the United States, as our canines are all nationally certified. In recent years, the need for explosive sweeps has increased as a result of the threat of overseas and domestic terrorism using explosive materials. Since the inception of the K9 program in 1998, we have had no founded litigations, or lawsuits resulting from the utilization of narcotics detection, criminal apprehensions, or explosive detection K9s.

The Wyoming Office of Homeland Security provided our recently retired explosive K9 (Lyra) to our office in the 2012/2013 timeframe.

1. A grant award is anticipated to occur in October 2021. At this time, we will establish a budget and accounting line items to prepare for the grant. After funding has been awarded, the Sheriff's Department will follow procurement policies and procedures to work with the selected vendor. At this time, we will arrange the dates of the canine training and acquisition period. We are anticipating this will be completed by the end of December 2021.

2. Beginning in January of 2022, we anticipate having the training scheduled and then completed by December 2022. We are estimating up to a year for this process to allow for fluctuating class schedules and dog availability.

Budget Narrative

We are requesting a total of \$17,000 to include the following: purchase of canine, single purpose explosive detector dog class, housing for deputy (3 weeks), lead, choke chain, line lead, tracking collar, muzzle, power dog, slicker brush, 2 stainless steel bowls and travel expenses for pick up and training at location. The cost of the canine is the largest at \$10,500, but provides a guarantee on health, workability and compatibility. Historically, the Sheriff's Department has used Vohne Liche Kennels located in Indiana and has been extremely happy with their services. The deputy that will be partnered with a K9 will travel to Indiana and be paired with a suitable K9 and then the team will undergo a threeweek training session prior to returning to the department. Once incorporated into the Laramie County Sheriff's Department the K9 and their handler will receive a minimum of sixteen hours a month of required training per the National Police K9 Association. We have attached a price quote from Vohne Liche Kennels to show a detailed breakdown of the costs associated with our request.
