25. PUBLIC HEARING regarding a subdivision permit & plat for Ironhorse, 3rd Filing, situated at: Tract 4, Ironhorse, 2nd Filing; a portion of Tract 11, Sunset Tracts, 3rd Filing; and two unplatted parcels located in the W1/2 of the NE1/4 of Sect 12, T14N, R67W of the 6th PM, Laramie County, WY.

Bryce Hamilton, Planning, Palma Land Planning, LLC, on behalf of Ironhorse Capital Limited Partnership, submitted a subdivision permit and plat application for properties located generally in the NE1/4 of Sect 12, T14N, R67W of the 6th PM, Laramie County, WY. He said the application submitted subdivides roughly 71 acres into 16 residential lots of approximately 5.25 acres each.

Mr. Hamilton said based on evidence provided, staff recommends approval of the subdivision permit and plat with the adoption of findings of fact a and b with two conditions: 1) The plat is revised prior to recordation to make Lot 9 compliant with AMEC density requirements and 2) Plat note added stating: No county maintenance of the right-of-way dedicated by the plat. The second condition was added by Mr. Hamilton after the staff report was submitted.

Casey Palma, Palma Land Planning, LLC, and agent, spoke about the project and how its scope has changed because the city of Cheyenne denied the outside user agreement to provide water to the area.

Chairman Lovett opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. Mike Cahoon, Dennis Brown and Terry Miller, residents, spoke on this item. Their concerns were property taxation, property line adjustment into the right-of-way, the aquifer and sustainable water for wells, and need for open space.

Justin Arnold, Planning, explained gross and net acreage within the county's land use regulations. He said the acreage is not related to tax purposes, only for resource purposes, and the AMEC memo allows for additional impervious surfaces to be used for the gross acreage calculation.

Hearing no further PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Lovett closed the hearing. A motion was made by Vice Chairman Malm, seconded by Commissioner Thompson, to adopt findings of fact a and b of the staff report and approve the subdivision permit and plat for Ironhorse, 3rd Filing, with two conditions: 1) The plat is revised prior to recordation to make Lot 9 compliant with AMEC density requirements and 2) A note to be added to the plat that no county maintenance of any right-of-way dedicated by the plat will be undertaken. Commissioner Thompson spoke about the residents' comments. He talked about the study created by the AMEC memo in 2014. He noted that the state engineer, a committee, and AMEC worked on the study. The memo gave the board a minimum lot size for subdivisions for recharge rates in different parts of the county. Commissioner Thompson felt it was unfortunate that the city of Cheyenne denied the outside user's agreement to provide water to the area. He said this project falls within the county's land use regulations.
