Sonny Keen, Planning, said AVI, PC, on behalf of Swan Ranch, LLC, submitted a zone change application for Terry Ranch Business Park and a portion of Terry Park, located at the intersection of Sheep Ave and State Hwy 223. She said the application requests a change from LU - Land Use to PUD - Planned Unit Development to provide a standard for acceptable uses allowed within the business park. Keen said the PUD will create a zone that allows uses across the Community Business, Light Industrial, and Heavy Industrial categories.

Keen said based on evidence provided, staff recommends approval of the zone change with the adoption of findings of fact a and b.

27. PUBLIC HEARING regarding a subdivision permit and plat for Bison24 - 137Crossing, 11th Filing, situated in the SW1/4 of Sect 30 and the NW1/4of Sect 31, T13N, R66W of the 6th PM, Laramie County, WY.

Bryce Hamilton, Planning, said Lovas Engineering, on behalf of TFS II, submitted a subdivision permit and plat application for property located generally in the SW1/4 of Sect 30 and NW1/4 of Sect 31, T13N, R66W, of the 6th PM, Laramie County, WY. The application was submitted to subdivide roughly 34 acres into 12 residential lots of approximately three (2.84) acres each.

Hamilton said based on evidence provided, staff recommends approval of the subdivision permit and plat with the adoption of findings of fact a and b with one condition: A nonadverse Chapter 23 recommendation is provided by DEQ prior to recordation.

Chris Lovas, Lovas Engineering and the applicant's agent, said the subdivision will tie into a privately maintained public water supply, and sewer will be provided by onsite septic and leach fields.

Chairman Lovett opened the hearing for PUBLIC COMMENT. Hearing no PUBLIC COMMENT, Chairman Lovett closed the hearing.

A motion was made by Vice Chairman Malm, seconded by Commissioner Holmes, to adopt findings of fact a and b of the staff report and to approve the subdivision permit and plat for Bison Crossing,11th Filing, with one condition.

Commissioner Malm clarified the AMEC memo was not applied to this subdivision, as it will be on a private water system. Justin Arnold, Planning, confirmed that the water system, Winchester Hills Utility Co, was permitted as a public water system in 1979, and regulations state that it is a grandfathered water system that can continue and expand its service.
